A Word from the Rector

Dear Friends,

As I write this, Charlene and I have recently returned from an amazing time away and I have just gotten back to the office and I'm beginning to get up to speed on things. I want to express my gratitude for this time away, and have done so elsewhere in this newsletter, so I'll not repeat it here.



As we come to the fall, it is my hope that we will work through some careful prayer and conversation about what it is that defines St. John's and how God is calling us to make a mark on this community, and beyond. The vestry and I are talking about what this process might look like, but one thing that came clear to me in my reading and reflection is the need to be much more focused and intentional about seeking the Lord's will for us as a parish and how we live that out in our common life.

As I told the vestry, I do not have any particular plan in my head – this is a process that we need to engage in together, without preconceptions. I look forward to this time of prayer and conversation, and I ask that you be in prayer as a specific process is worked out.

I was able to do a great deal of reading during my time away, and several things have come from that time. On a personal level, I realized that I have let my reading slip and I need to recover that. So, in addition to daily time in prayer and the Bible, I am adding a minimum of 30 minutes of reading, 60 minutes when possible. I'll be reading about theology, Bible, culture, religion and society, and other topics to generally feed my thinking, teaching and preaching.

Second, I'm thinking of starting some sort of book club here at St. John's. I would select a book of general interest, then we could gather for an evening of desert and conversation around that book. For a first shot, I would recommend "Same Kind of Different as Me" by Ron Hall and Denver Moore. It is the true story of an friendship between an upscale art dealer, a homeless drifter and a woman who brought them together.

It address issues of race, class and much more. It is being made into a movie scheduled for release on February 3, 2017 and starring Renée Zellweger, Jon Voight and Djimon Hounsou. If enough of you are interested, we will begin with a session, probably in later October to discuss it.

Finally, I thought that I would offer up some suggestions from the reading that I have done. I found "Becoming a Blessed Church" by M. Graham Standish quite personally challenging and it has greatly influenced my thinking. Reading this book may give you some insights into the process we will engage in through the fall.

"A Long Obedience in the Same Direction: Discipleship in an Instant Society" was first published in 1980, and has already become a modern-day devotional classic. It is by Eugene Peterson, who wrote the translation of the Bible known as "The Message." I must say that I loved this book. His writing is clear and straightforward, his insights powerful. It is based on a series of Psalms known as the "Psalms of Ascents," (Ps. 120-134) a reference to their being sung by the people as they ascended toward the temple in Jerusalem for festival worship. I found it so powerful that I am planning to develop a study guide based on it for us to use in small groups and the Sunday sermons beginning at the start of Lent and going through Pentecost.

It is great to be back with you! It was refreshing beyond words to have this time away and I look forward to our renewed life together!

Vestry Notes The vestry held its regular monthly meeting on Thursday, August 18, 2016, 7 p.m. in the Parish Hall.

The Treasurer, Steve Bradley, reported that July saw total income of \$17,781 against a budget of \$15,450. This is an improvement, but income for the year (January through July) is down \$9,927 from anticipated. The treasurer estimates that about \$3,000 of this will be made up by those behind on pledges and the rest is likely lost to people who have moved or otherwise informed us that they will not be able to complete their pledges. Expenses were \$19,984 against a budget of \$14,298. Increased expenses were largely attributable to a quarterly pension payment being made early, and higher than expected costs for stripping and waxing the parish hall floor. This left a deficit of \$2,203 for the month and \$4,939 for the year.

Junior Warden, Kathy Oas, reported roof work and painting have been completed. Many other ordinary repairs have been completed. See the letter from Roof Campaign Chair Lee Steininger for more information on the funds raised.

The container for recycled paper will be removed. It was decided that the very small amount of money this brings in (less than \$50 per year) is not worth the trouble and the unsightly container. Further, everyone in the area has curbside recycling, so there is little need for centralized recycling facilities.

Fr. Eric Turner thanked the vestry for the provision of the sabbatical and expressed appreciation for the many folks who stepped up and took on additional responsibilities during this time. A much needed step for the life of St. John's is to carry on a series of prayers and conversations to re-focus St. John's purpose and how we are to live that out in our community and beyond. More about this is in Fr. Eric's letter to the parish at the beginning of this newsletter.

Next meeting will be Thursday, September 15, 2016, 7 p.m. in the Parish Hall. All are welcome.

✓ About Anthony LaMort: he currently serves as pastor and executive director of Reconciliation Christian Ministries - a non-geographical, all-inclusive Christian Fellowship, and as Minister of Music for St. John's Episcopal Church in Melbourne, FL. He attended programs at the Mannes College of Music, the Manhattan School of Music, and the music schools of the Universities of Michigan and Iowa. He counts among his musical mentors such organ luminaries as Leonard Raver, Paul Martin Maki and McNeil Robinson.

He has performed recitals at St. Patrick's Cathedral, at St. Peter's Church at the Citicorp Center and other NYC venues, and elsewhere across the U.S. Active in chamber music, choral direction, composition and jazz, he also plays harpsichord, xylophone, vibraphone and a variety of early string and wind instruments.

✓ About the Pipe Organ, +: It was originally constructed by the Austin Company in the early 1900's. Housed in their own annex, its approx. 1200 pipes are arrayed in 22 'ranks' or sets of pipes, each with a unique tonal quality. They are controlled by a three 'manuals' or keyboards and a pedal console in the balcony. In addition to the pipes themselves, St. John's organ also boasts a zimbelstern, a glockenspiel, and newly installed carillon bells.
