A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

Near the end of seminary, those studying for ordained ministry in the Episcopal Church are required to sit for four days of examinations known as the "General Ordination Examinations."

We are tested in seven areas: Old Testament, New Testament, Theology, Church History, Liturgics, Canon Law, and Theory and Practice of Ministry. The test is mostly long essay questions, but my favorite section was a group of short essay questions known as the "Coffee Hour Questions," designed to duplicate the kinds of off-the-wall questions one might get at a coffee hour. One has always stuck with me: "Isn't 'stewardship' just a fancy word for fundraising?"

Why don't you just call it what it is?"

Calling it 'stewardship' can seem like an effort to put a spiritual veneer over the reality of a fundraising campaign. The truth is that it is both. We cannot deny that there is a fund-raising element to what we do at this time of year. Yet, giving of what God has given us is an essential part of our faith and our devotion to Christ. About a third of the parables of Jesus are about money. This is not because Jesus is obsessed with money, but because He knows that we are.

As we all know, it costs money to run a parish, and much as we don't like to admit it, there are business-like aspects to keeping a church going. There are bills to be paid, payroll met, buildings maintained, government requirements to be met, etc. Budgets must be planned prudently and monitored carefully.

We operate on a razor's edge and even began 2017 with an anticipated deficit of a little over \$7,000. The year has gone better than expected, yet funds are tight and there are many things we would like to do that we simply are not able to fund at this time.

We have launched a major new outreach ministry (Family Promise of Brevard) and will be launching others soon. We have many members involved in a variety of ministries in the community and beyond, and St. John's is very generous in special offerings. Yet, this mission orientation is not adequately represented in our operating budget. We would be greatly helped by a parish secretary/administrator. Our maintenance budget depends heavily on the generous contributions of time and talents by a small number of (mostly older!) members, and many repairs and improvements are put off for financial reasons. I could go on, but you get the idea.


More importantly, we need to give. My friend, and the Bishop who ordained me, once wrote a little pamphlet called "Tithing: A Habit to Mend the Heart." Sadly, it is out of print, so I can't share it with you. His point was that the Lord does not call us to give because He needs our money. He calls us to give because it is the only antidote to the hold that money has on our hearts, and on our souls.

**Giving turns the heart toward God. "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."
(Matthew 6:21, Luke 12:34)**

So, stewardship is fund-raising, but it is much more. It is how we fund a budget, how we operate together as a church. But, it is also an essential piece of our relationship with the Lord. As you pray over and consider your giving to St. John's in the coming year, ask yourself not only what you are supporting, but what you are inviting God to do in your heart and life.

From the Stewardship Chair

Our 2018 Stewardship Campaign is underway and Sunday, November 19 is our designated "Pledge Sunday." I will address the congregation on October 29 and other members of the congregation will speak briefly on November 5 and 12.

We ask that you spend time in thought and prayer for St. John's. You will receive your official pledge card in the mail in about a week. You can place the completed pledge card in the offertory plate at church, or you can mail it to St. John's. Since we are a forgiving body, tardy pledge cards will be graciously accepted. But, keep in mind that the Vestry needs your input in a timely manner in developing our 2018 budget.

The Stewardship Campaign at St. John's Episcopal Church is not a "fund-raising endeavor." It is much more than that. As Christians, we believe that not only are we a gift from God; but, all that we possess are gifts from God. We all possess time (of varying amounts), talents (of varying levels), and treasurer (our assets and income). It's this time of the year we are asked to reflect and project how we can give these gifts back to St. John's. Consider how you can devote your time and talent in the form of parish ministries, as your Vestry has done in many ways. There are dozens of ways that you can serve St. John's, and others through St. John's, by your contributions of time and talent.

Like any business, St. John's has expenses to cover; personnel, facilities, equipment and operations. Your generous financial contributions are essential for our church to operate effectively and responsibly. The vestry is committed to operating "in the black" and depends on your completed pledge card in order to project our annual income. You may want to refer to the article in this newsletter from our treasurer, Steve Bradley, for more information about anticipated income and expenses for 2018.

The Biblical standard for giving is the tithe (10% of our income). While many of us fall short of this standard, we ask that you consider a long-range plan of pledging slightly more each year. The Stewardship Committee thanks you for your prayerful and generous consideration.

We are embarking on a new Christmas Outreach this year called "Gifts from the Heart Christmas Shop."





Vestry Notes

The Vestry met on Thursday, October 19. The vestry formation discussion centered on newcomers' experience when coming to St. John's. Fr. Eric noted that there have been no new member visits, as measured by pew cards, in 4-5 months.

The Treasurer reported the month ending September 30 and the 2018 budget. September was generally favorable, especially since one Sunday was missed due to the hurricane. A significant deficit was expected for the month due to a large quarterly payment for fire and liability insurance and September being a historically low month for income. See adjacent table for more details. Steve went through the 2018 budget assumptions, most of which are based on measured trends, known expense increases, like health insurance premiums, and frozen salaries for paid personnel. The amount of pledges needed to make the proposed 2018 budget is \$192,692 which is a 4 % increase from the 2017 budget. The proposed budget for 2018 was approved.

Hal Martin, the Stewardship Chair, summarized plans for the upcoming Stewardship drive, which will include a letter to each household, newsletter items, oral and written testimonials from parishioners. November 19 will be Pledge Sunday.

Fr. Eric reminded the Vestry that it is time to begin planning for Vestry nominations for outgoing Vestry members (3), and for delegates to the Diocesan Convention.

Twenty years ago, St. John's was one of their key partners when they went to Singapore. After serving in Palm Bay for the last ten years, they plan to move at the end of the year to serve with TEAM (www.Team.org).

TEAM has 600 missionaries around the world, about 180 of whom live in Asia. Fr. Loren and Linda will live in northern Thailand: from there, Linda will coordinate member care for missionaries and their families working in some of the most difficult corners of Asia. Loren will coordinate strategy and leadership development—focused on planting churches among seven unreached peoples who currently live outside the reach of the Church.



St. John's Proposed 2018 Budget

The proposed budget for 2018 is for \$215,612. This represents an increase of \$8,294 above the 2017 budget, which fell short of covering expenses by \$7,224. It should be noted that due to vestry actions and the generosity of parishoners the 2017 projected deficit has been eliminated.


The 2018 budget for each major line item is listed below:

Employee Costs	\$133,937
Parish Operations:	14,959
Parish Facilities:	45,322
Parish Programs	1,525
Diocesan Pledge	19,869
Total	\$215,612



Employee costs include all salaries, pension and medical insurance. Salaries do not include any raises for 2018 and medical insurance assumes a 3% increase. Parish Operations include office & copier expenses, telephone, internet and altar & flower expenses. Parish Facilities include all maintenance and lawn service, FPL and Fire & Liability Insurance (FLI) costs. FLI increased 7% this year and the budget assumes another 5% increase in 2018. Parish Programs include newcomer, fellowship and stewardship costs. Diocesan Pledge reflects 10% of St. John's Pledge and Plate giving to the Diocese of Central Florida. This budget covers the minimum expected expenses for 2018. Any additional income would enable the vestry to further decrease our Restricted account deficit and also consider employee raises and increases to Parish Programs. The vestry and myself thank St. John's parishioners in advance for your continuing support during the 2018 Stewardship campaign.
