A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

What does it mean to be a man in the age of #metoo? 'Old fashioned' ideas like chivalry and decency seem a bit, well, old fashioned and some feminists even suggest that the idea that men should defend or stand up for women is itself sexist.



And what does our faith say to this crisis? Surely it goes without saying that men are to be respectful of others, and to never take advantage of power and position for personal gain or pleasure. But the call on Christians is not simply to avoid sin, but to seek to be "salt and light," to be "leaven in the lump," etc. We are to be positive change agents in the world about us both because this directly impacts God's children whom he loves and because it is part of how we commend our faith to a hurting and broken world.

I am thrilled that we are deep into a national reckoning on the horrible behavior of some men. The Harvey Weinstains, Louis CKs, Kevin Spaceys, Bill Cosbys, Roger Ailes, Al Franken and co. need to have their comeuppance. But it is not enough just to get the egregiously guilty to stop. We all need to change our behavior and attitude. No more "wink, wink, nudge, nudge." No more "boys will be boys." The days of the 'casting couch' need to be over, whether in entertainment or any other field.

This requires men to hold one another accountable, seriously and aggressively/. If "grab 'em by the ***" is 'locker room talk' (it's not in any locker room I've ever been in) that kind of talk needs to be called out and shut down immediately. It also means that women need to speak up, and fight back, and do so quickly. Harassment and abuse are not just the product of a few twisted people but of a culture that sees sex as a commodity, sees men as natural aggressors if they're 'man' enough, and expects women to just be quiet and let the men be in charge.

If I've learned anything as a pastor dealing with troubled relationships, it is that once we sort out who's done what, all parties need to change their behavior, not just the guilty party. The focus is usually on the transgressor, but this kind of behavior is part of a larger system that has adjusted in many ways to these patterns of behavior. Like the

family of an alcoholic, the attention may be on the drinker, but the rest of the family has also accommodated, tolerated and compensated for the alcoholic's behavior and lasting change requires that all adopt new patterns.

Innocent men will need to step up. Guilty men will need to lose their opportunities, privilege and perhaps their freedom. Women who are victims will need to stand up. Women who are not victims need to be counted. While they are rare, women who harass will need to be called out with all the fierceness with which we call out men. Sadly, there will be some who will make accusations falsely, seeing an opportunity personal gain or vengeance, and they will need to be dealt with aggressively as well.

There are many uncomfortable conversations ahead of us. What actually qualifies as harassment? When does flirting or asking for a date become harassment? Surely it is not right that a simple accusation can end a person's career, but these kinds of cases are notoriously difficult to prove. While it is important that we begin with believing the victim, we cannot ignore the accused's rights to due process and no one should be deprived of livelihood or freedom without due process. Furthermore, objective standards are required. The standard of guilt cannot simply be the feelings of one person, especially not in a climate in which a mere accusation can end a career. I know a priest whose career was ended because he commented to a mother (and several others standing around) that her teenage daughter was "developing into a fine young woman." Her mother took this as a comment on her daughter's bust size, complained to the bishop and he was removed from ministry for three years. But even after he served the suspension, what parish can risk calling him as rector with this on his record?

While addressing these issues is certainly a responsibility that reaches across religions, and even non-religion, as Christians I believe we bear a special responsibility to be at the forefront of change. As our Baptism service says, we are to "respect the dignity of every human being." Surely that means at least we are to work to ensure that all God's children are free from harassment and abuse. I don't know of Biblical proof texts that address sexual harassment and abuse per se, but it is abundantly clear that we are to respect, love, and care for one another, and to maintain a sexual ethic centered in self-restraint and that honors the boundaries of the marriage covenant.

You may not be an abuser. You may not be a victim. But where might you be a part of the solution rather than just a sideliners? How can we demonstrate the love of Christ and respect the dignity of every human being on this difficult subject?

St. John's Completes Successful Family Promise Year!

The third and final Family Promise hosting week for 2017 was successfully completed over Thanksgiving week. Many in our congregation sacrificed time, resources, and worked tirelessly to ensure our two guest families were warmly welcomed and comfortable during their stay from **November 19 – 26**. We housed and provided three meals a day for four adults and three children ages 14, 7, and four months. Following all three hostings, the guests and Family Promise of Brevard leadership have been very complimentary of our program and congregation.

For St. John's to provide a week of hosting up to four times a year requires the support of most of the congregation with many doing much more than their share. In particular, our seven Captains do a magnificent job. The Captains and their respective teams are listed below, several people contributing to more than just one team:

Our Family Promise ministry has allowed St. John's to contribute significantly to helping homeless families find permanent, affordable housing, and employment when necessary. For example, in Brevard County, 87% of 87 families entering the program in the past three years have found housing in an average of 34 days. Of those, 86% were still in housing a year later. While the families clearly are benefiting from Family Promise, we at St. John's have found we are receiving much more than we are giving. We need additional volunteers to spread the workload more equitably and to provide back up help. If you haven't yet volunteered, please do so by getting in touch with Lee Steininger and/or filling out a volunteer form located in the parish hall.

We look forward to hosting four more one week periods in 2018 beginning January 28 – February 4.

Annual Convention of the Diocese of Central Florida

The Annual Convention of the Diocese of Central Florida will be held **Friday and Saturday, January 26-27** at Trinity Episcopal Church in Vero Beach. Elected by the vestry to attend from St. John's will be Anneke Bertsch, Linda Fletcher and Katie Wilson and Julie Miller will be our alternate. Fr. Eric Turner and Deacon Elizabeth Murray will attend as clergy.

The subject that appears likely to generate the most heat is changes to the way parish giving to the Diocese is calculated. For many years, the Diocese of Central Florida has operated on a "10-10-10" plan of giving. Individual members were asked to give 10% to their local parish, parishes were to give 10% to the Diocese and the Diocese would give 10% to the General Church. The 10% from parish to Diocese was mandatory, and there was an additional "asking" above the 10% for larger parishes.

The General Church (more commonly referred to as the "National Church," but the term "General Church" is actually the correct language) has actually asked much more, as high as 21%, but this was voluntary and there was no penalty if a Diocese did not meet the standard. At the General Convention next summer (the once every three years governing body for the General Church), it is expected that the asking will be reduced to 15%, but made mandatory, with specific penalties for Dioceses that do not meet the standard. These would include loss of seat and voice at General Convention, loss of seats on various other General Church bodies, loss of ability to apply for certain kinds of grants, etc.

In order to fund the increase from 10% to 15%, an increase in giving from the parishes would be required. However, there is an additional complicating factor. Beginning right after the election and consecration of Bishop Gene Robinson as Bishop of the Diocese of New Hampshire in 2003, this Diocese created a structure called "Alternative Giving." This was done as a protest to the shift at the General Church level to accept and embrace an openly gay, non-celibate man as Bishop, as well as related changes to the church's teaching on human sexuality. Alternative Giving maintained the standard of 10% of Diocesan income going beyond the Diocese but drastically reduced the funds going to the General Church. Alternative Giving was designated to various ministries which have changed over time, but the largest share has always gone to our companion Diocese, the Episcopal Diocese of Honduras. Initially, the default position was that all 10% of Diocesan income would go to Alternative Giving, but individual parishes were given the option to designate all or part of the 10% of their gifts to the Diocese to go to the General Church. Until the last few years, this meant that of the 10% of Diocesan income that would go to the General Church, over 80% went to Alternative Giving and less than 20% to the General Church. This means that while the General Church was asking for 21% (or 19% or 17% in recent years), Central Florida was giving less than 2%.

A couple of years ago, the default position for the Diocese was flipped so that it was assumed that 10% of what parishes donated to the Diocese would go to the General Church, but churches had the option to designate all or part of that to go to Alternative Giving. For the last two years, St. John's has designated that 50% of what we give to the Diocese would go to Alternative Giving, leaving the other 50% to go to the General Church. The primary issue in the vestry discussion was the concern that the ministries supported by the Alternative Giving structure would be suddenly cut off and seriously hindered.

The Diocese is now restructuring the budget so that we can meet the 15% asking, expected to become mandatory in 2019, without cutting off support of the Alternative Giving recipients, most especially the Diocese of Honduras. The Alternative Giving structure would disappear, but these ministries would become part of the outreach budget of the Diocese. 12% giving from parish to Diocese should allow this to happen.

This will not effect the 2018 budget, but likely will take effect for the 2019 budget.

Please pray for the delegates and leaders of the Diocese to have wisdom and discernment as we meet and take counsel together.

The net result were revenues \$2,000 better than budget and expenses \$1,500 less than budgeted.
