Dear Friends,

Sometimes we forget how dependent we are on things that are completely beyond our control. First and foremost, we are here only because we were created to be here!

*For it was you who formed my inward parts;
you knit me together in my mother's womb.
I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully
made. Wonderful are your works; that I know
very well.*

Psalm 139:13-14



You didn't create your life, you didn't give birth to yourself, you didn't create your mind and design the intricacies of your body. You were designed and created by God and brought into the world by human parents entirely without your influence. You didn't create this world either, with all the air, water and food we need to survive and thrive.

For May, the Outreach Focus will be Solar Light for Africa. St. John's has long and generously supported this work, under Executive Director, Charlene Turner. Two teams have already gone to Uganda in 2018, including a team from our neighbors, Holy Apostle's in Satellite Beach. In the first half of July, an open team will have the adventure of a lifetime and in the second half, there will be a large team from Galilee Episcopal Church in Virginia Beach, VA. For June, the Outreach Focus will be the Children's Hunger Project, providing pre-packaged meals that require no cooking and are distributed directly into qualifying elementary aged children's backpacks on Friday afternoons. Qualification is determined solely at the discretion of the teacher and requires no parental involvement. The meals are designed to meet minimum nutritional requirements for the weekend and require no parental supervision or assistance.

School of Healing Prayer

When Jesus had called the Twelve together, he gave them power and authority to drive out all demons and to cure diseases, and he sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick.
Luke 9: 1-2

Praying and praying for one another are essential to the Christian life. Yet there is so much more that God can do in our lives through prayer! Indeed, healing prayer as a way to allow God to address and heal many burdens we carry is a tremendous gift, but there is much to learn and do if we are to take advantage of what God has given us.

The Rev. Francis MacNutt, along with his wife, Judith, have been leaders in the ministry of Healing Prayer for decades in the Episcopal Church and beyond. They founded Christian Healing Ministries, based in Jacksonville as a center both for healing prayer and for training Christians in this ministry.

They have a training program to both experience healing prayer as well as learn to help others through healing prayer. There are four levels to their program, but each level stands on its own. One of their trained facilitators, Brenda Cole-Milner, is now here at St. John's and will be offering the Level 1 training in the fall of 2018.

Level 1 provides a foundational, practical approach to becoming a prayer minister and/or developing a prayer ministry. This course offers a scriptural basis for God's gift of healing prayer and teaches the student how to be an effective prayer minister. (13 weeks, 1 day per week, 2.5 hours per class). Class will be facilitated through DVD's, discussion and prayer.

Family Promise a Big Success

Family Promise of Brevard (FPOB) continues to successfully help homeless families find permanent, stable housing and St. John's is proud to be an integral part of the program. As we look back on our participation, we have hosted four groups of families since June 2017. A brief look at the status of each follows. Names are omitted to protect family privacy.



JUNE hosting:

Family 81: Mom, dad and three children graduated into an apartment in Cape Canaveral. Shortly after moving in, Mom lost her job at the Port. The family disengaged from the FPOB aftercare program and is believed to be living with family.

Family 82: Mom, dad, and four children, including a newborn, chose to leave the shelter program to stay in a hotel once dad found employment. They moved into a family shelter in Indian River County, but still have not found their path to stable housing. It is believed they are now living with family.

Family 83: Dad and two children graduated into housing and have been stably housed for over seven months. Dad pays his rent 1-2 months in advance now and is actively saving money with the help of FPOB aftercare.

SEPTEMBER hosting:

Family 84: Mom and four children graduated into housing with the help of Eckerd Connects in early October. They have been engaged in case management through Eckerd and remain in housing.

Family 85: Mom, dad and two children graduated into housing in late September. They were the first family to be helped with a Help Us Move In (HUMI) grant which paid move in deposits. They remain stably housed and engaged with FPOB.

NOVEMBER hosting:

Family 86: Mom, dad and two children graduated into housing with Family Grace ministries the week of Christmas! They remain stably housed and engaged in aftercare with FPOB and Eckerd Connects. Thankfully, the family is two months ahead in rent and actively seeking employment.

Family 88: Mom, dad and infant graduated into housing with Community of Hope! Mom's other children were able to move in with them and they remain engaged in aftercare.

JANUARY hosting:

Family 89: Mom, dad and two children graduated into housing with Peacewind Ministries! They remain in aftercare and after months of planning and saving bought a car to help increase self sufficiency. HUMI funds were used to provide a gradually decreasing, stepped up program of rent assistance to ensure sustainability.

Family 91: Mom and two children chose to exit the program and move in with a family friend due to family considerations. They remain connected to services through Brevard Family Partnership and Department of Children and Families.

Family 92: Mom and son had to leave the program due to medical conditions. She has remained in contact with FPOB and has been staying with family in Kissimmee while she stabilizes her health. She is waiting for a temporary position in Brevard Public Schools to become a permanent position before she moves back to Brevard.

In summary, seven of ten families graduated into housing, a wonderful story. St. John's investment in time, talent, and hospitality during the host weeks have proved an important building block in how FPOB puts families back on track for housing and financial independence. We need more volunteers to reduce the workload on our current team and improve an already excellent program. If you are not a volunteer, come and join us. It's fun and very rewarding.

From a Family Promise Graduate



"Every day, I thank God for working through you, the rest of Family Promise, many churches, businesses, and others. Around this time every year, I am filled with a flood of emotions. I'm in awe of how good God is, and how far He has brought us! Four years ago, we were homeless. Four years ago, God led us to Family Promise.

I keep my note on the refrigerator from Jonathan's first day as a homeless child at Anderson Elementary school. You all worked with the schools to ensure that he felt so welcomed, and not ashamed because of his status. One of his teachers wrote a personal note letting him

know how glad she was to have him in her class. That might seem like a small thing to some people, but to us, it was huge. You all made sure that Jonathan had a buddy to walk with to the bus stop every morning. I thank you. And while I looked for work during the day, I knew when I met Jonathan at the bus stop after school, his buddy would be right there with him. Again, many thanks. For every meal, kind word, bed to sleep in, smile, hug, prayer, and everything in between, thank you all. At a time when the bottom had dropped out, God used you all to lift us up, to strengthen, and to encourage us.

Even after we left the program, you still continued to check on us. Again, many thanks. Because of your care for us, I was led to a part-time job at Suntree United Methodist Church. The job started out as twelve hours per week and has since grown to twenty hours per week. I thoroughly enjoy working there as a receptionist. I enjoy people and know that God uses it in a way to encourage others. The job is what I needed while Jonathan is in school during the day. Thank you so much for your kind words on my behalf.

I'm still doing the online work as well, and really enjoying it. We are still enjoying our home that God blessed us with. I stand in awe of God. In four short years, He has and continues to work on our behalf! To God alone be all of the glory!

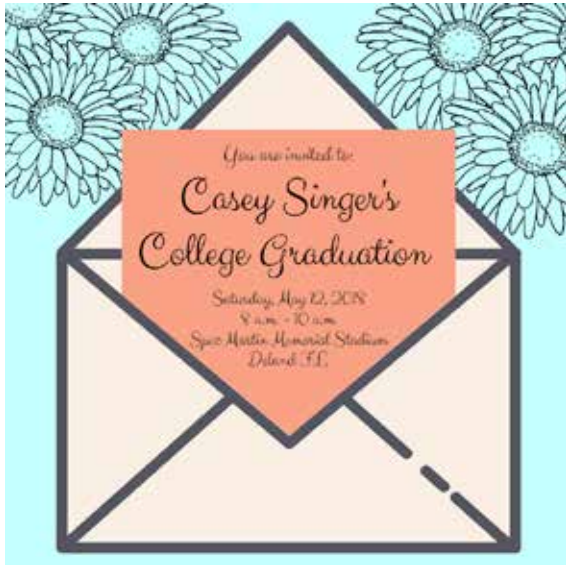

Vestry Notes

The Vestry met on **Thursday, April 19.** Steve Bradley's Treasurer's report was less favorable for the month of March and year to date, primarily due to increased employee costs (Fr. Eric's Health Savings Account was paid 4 months ahead). The financial result were revenues \$947 short of budget and expenses \$763 more than budgeted.

Kathy Oas, Junior Warden, reported on the state of the buildings and grounds projects. Funds were approved from the "Memorial Fund" to replace the sanctuary carpet (up to \$5,000).

The vestry discussed Vestry Retreat follow up needs, recent paid advertising on Google searches and Facebook and possibilities for neighborhood-wide events. Parish Retreat follow up activities, will include an open parish discussion on Sunday, May 20, during the Christian Ed hour at 9 a.m. and a course on Healing Prayer is being planned for the fall. Lee Steinger will begin work to develop a 10-year plan for our facilities. Fr. Eric and Kathy Oas will attend a seminar put on by the Diocese on "Worshiping in Safety."

Family Promise is Fun but is that enough? I have been involved in many outreach programs at St. Johns over the past years. Some of them brought many community members to the campus of St. John's Episcopal Church. From Youth Programs to Anchor house, to VBS, Survivor on Egg Island, Bicycle Give away, Music concerts, Brevard Rescue Mission, Seniors at Lunch etc. etc.

Did these programs and events increase the population of our faith community? I'd say no, not at all. Did the community of Eau Gallie benefit from our effort? I would think so. Do these events bring the community closer to a relationship with Jesus? Maybe.... If done in the spirit of love, it reflects the love of Christ. That we have. We may never really know if it affected their spiritual journey or not.



If Bishop Gregory said it once he said it three or four times. Don't think you need to start up some new programs to define who we are. I have noticed in the past when an outreach is held up by a segment of the congregation it is successful. When the parish is no longer involved, it will fade away under the leadership of two or only one person. If we are to decide who we are in the world, how we can be a light. I think what I have heard from most people is that we have to start by taking care of each other and acting like the body of Christ to each other.

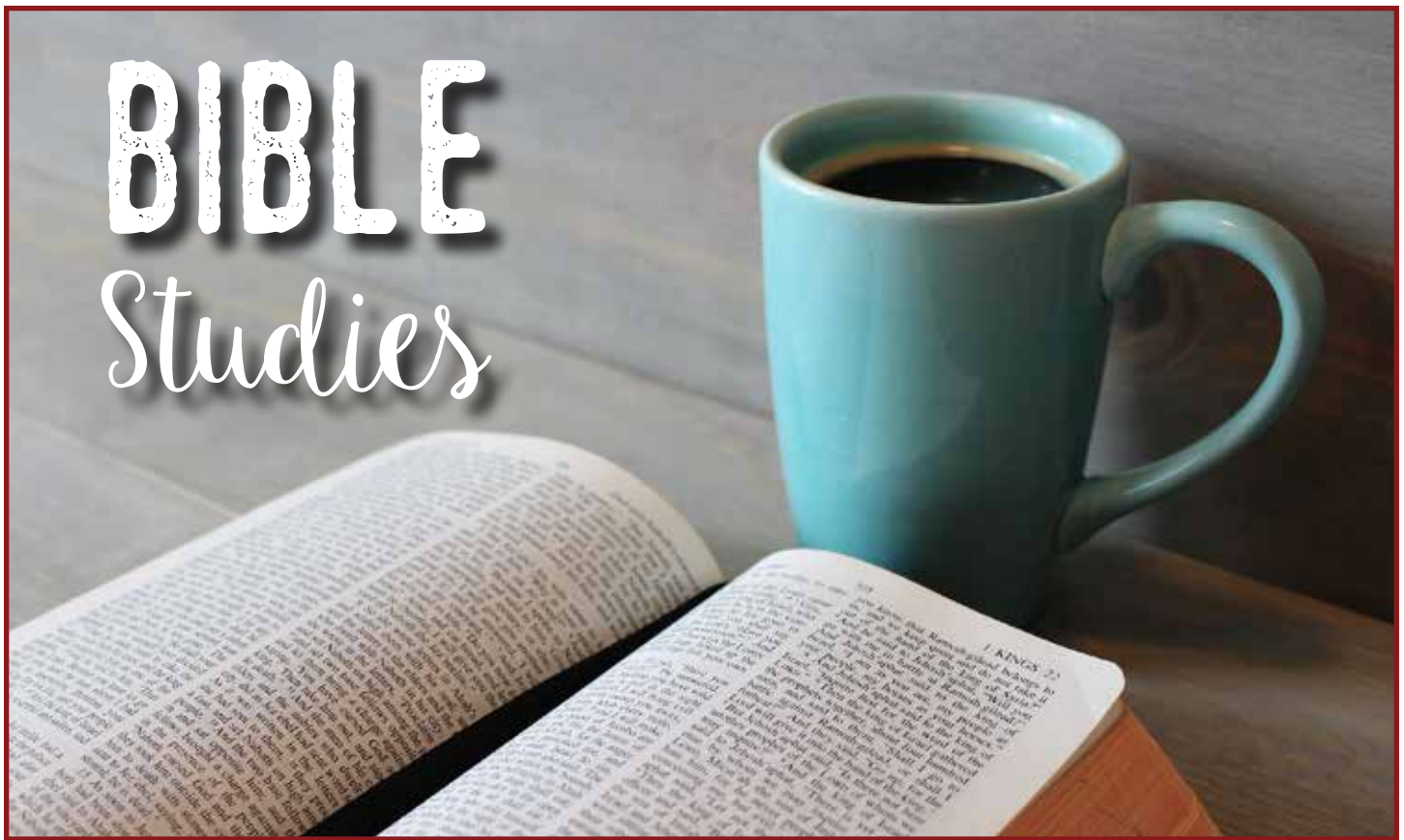

Family Promise is an excellent way to show this crazy world of ours that we care for each other and for those who are in need that live in our area. Will this bring more people to St. John's? I don't know. Maybe. Maybe not. Will the families remember that loving Christians helped them in a time of need and were kind, compassion and helpful? I'm sure of it.

We have been offered a great opportunity to grow in love within our parish, and to shine the light of Christ to our community. We will be Blessed. If it is to continue to show who we are.... More of us will need to be involved. It can't be a ministry for just a few. It needs to be who we are as a church.

God's peace be with all of you on your journey, and I hope you will join the love that is growing in our church. That's who we need to be right now.
