A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

I would like to encourage your prayers for at least these two things over the summer.

First, Charlene and I will be leaving for Solar Light for Africa's Summer Mission 2018 on July 2. We have a small team but it does include a student from Melbourne and an adult who is a member of Ascension Catholic Church. We will begin a large project powering orphan homes at an orphanage in northern Uganda called Otino Waa. That work will extend over some additional trips. We will also light a block of teacher homes at a school near Jinja (southern Uganda). This may seem an odd thing to do but providing solar on the teacher homes is a huge help to recruiting skilled and devoted teachers to remote a school that can't pay good salaries. That team will leave Uganda on July 16 and the same day a very large team from an Episcopal Church in Virginia Beach, Virginia will arrive for another two week trip that Charlene will be leading. Pray for safe travel, good work, great relationships and endurance for Charlene!

Second, although I haven't been talking about it much, the every three year General Convention of The Episcopal Church meets this summer, July 3 - 13 in Austin, Texas. While there will, no doubt, be some surprises, the issue that is likely to attract the most attention will be how rites for same sex marriage are handled. Such rites have already been developed and were authorized for "trial use" at the General Convention 2015. This means that they may be used, but at the discretion of the local bishop. Bishop Brewer of this Diocese does not permit the use of these rites. It seems likely that these rites will become "authorized rites" of the church, the effective equivalent of putting it in *The Book of Common Prayer*. This would mean that the local bishop would no longer have authority over the use of the rites and there would begin to be same sex marriage in Central Florida. Some will celebrate this and some will mourn, but it will mean some stressful times in the life of the Diocese.

A second issue that may actually be more significant over the long haul is that the Convention will consider beginning the development of a new Book of Common Prayer, or, as I suspect is more likely, a collection of various approved rites. The current BCP was finally approved in 1979. Considering that this revision process could easily stretch over a decade, that will mean 50 years or so from the last revision, which is about the normal schedule. Considering how central the BCP is in the life of the Episcopal Church, this will become a major focus for years to come.

Outreach Focus

For July and August, the Outreach Focus will be Family Promise of Brevard. Family Promise has found that there is a significant gap between the cost of even “low income” housing in Brevard County and what families living on minimum wage or near minimum wage jobs can afford. To begin to address this, they are looking to launch a program to purchase run-down properties, fix them up as low cost rentals, and make them available to FP families. The Eau Gallie area is perfectly suited for this work with a high number of vacant and run-down properties. Funds donated in July and August will be used to help launch this new part of our Family Promise outreach.

All gifts in the lavender pew envelopes, or clearly marked “outreach” in the months of **July and August** will go to Family Promise of Brevard.

Family Promise Father Gives Back Lets Match It (or more) During FPOB Appeal

David Hill of Rockledge and his three children were the third family to enter the Family Promise program in its current organizational structure. That was almost six years ago. Since then, the family has transitioned from homeless to permanent housing and a stable family environment. At a recent FPOB Coordinators meeting, David expressed his deep appreciation to FPOB for their assistance in obtaining housing and continuing family support over the six year span by donating two thousand dollars to the Family Promise of Brevard Program!!



David is a veteran of the first Gulf war and has combat related disability. He home schools son David, 15; daughter Genesis, 13; and young son Timothy, 12. The family will be leaving Brevard soon for Washington state to be closer to family and VA treatment for his disability. His generosity and strong belief in the FP program; however, will remain as the basis for a new FPOB Appeal fundraising initiative.

The FPOB Appeal is needed to offset the loss of approximately \$65,000 in government grant contributions in 2018 and cancellation of the 2018 Christmas concert fund raiser. Prospects for future grant dollars are not bright despite FPOB continuing to write many grant requests, so the need is considerable and expected to be ongoing.

The goal for each FPOB participating church is to match David Hill's contribution of \$2,000. If that is achieved, the goal of \$65K should be reached and, hopefully, with the Appeal reaching other potential contributors, much more. The Appeal will be run by Rock, Paper, and Simple a Melbourne company.

The Appeal is expected to kick off as early as July. The Congregation will be notified of the exact dates and format for St. John's participation.

Vestry Notes

The Vestry met on **Thursday, May 19**. Steve Bradley's Treasurer's report was less favorable for year to date, primarily due to increased employee costs resulting from the rector's HSA (Health Savings Account) being paid early. The year to date financial result were revenues \$637 ahead of budget and expenses \$2,351 more than budgeted. The vestry discussed Vestry retreat follow up activities, Parish Retreat follow up activities, long range facility planning, and upcoming spiritual and safety classes.

About the Facilitator

Brenda Cole-Milner became involved in the healing ministry in 2000 when she first attended a Fishnet Conference (now CHM Ignite) with a fellow church member in Connecticut. She then enrolled in The School of Healing Prayer at All Saints Episcopal Church in Fitchburg, Massachusetts, where she continued to learn more about the healing ministry through 3 levels of The School of Healing Prayer. After level 2, she was asked to help facilitate level 1 and level 2 classes within All Saints Church. Brenda felt that she was being led by the Holy Spirit to begin a healing ministry at her home church, St Mark's Episcopal in Leominster, Massachusetts. It was there that she facilitated along with another School of Healing Prayer graduate, training to equip individuals to lead healing prayer teams within the church. After approximately 1 year, St Mark's Episcopal Church was equipped to offer healing prayer, soaking prayer, and intercessory prayer to individuals within and outside of the church. At this time, St Mark's effectively had 8 prayer ministers within the church to conduct intercessory prayer after Communion each Sunday. These teams of two rotated on a weekly basis. Longer needed prayer times or soaking prayer, could be arranged by appointment. Many graduates from The School of Healing Prayer planted several healing ministries within their churches as well. Brenda also organized a Healing Conference at St Mark's with guest speaker Nigel Mumford who was a close friend of Francis and Judith MacNutt.

Brenda continues to attend CHM Ignite, now in Vermont yearly, and makes prayer a part of her everyday life. Brenda wishes to share her gift of this ministry with St. John's in Melbourne.

Bishop Brewer on Embracing Our Neighborhoods

From start to finish, the Rt. Rev. Gregory O. Brewer's annual address underscored and extended this year's 2018 Diocesan Convention theme, "Evangelism—Embracing Our Neighborhoods."

Uniting for Relief

This past year, diocesan outreach efforts have included food distribution (including 250,000 pounds of emergency FEMA relief channeled through St. John's, Kissimmee); food pantries; two shipments to the U.S. Virgin Islands; and financial donations sent to St. John the Divine in Houston in the wake of Hurricane Harvey, Brewer said. Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD) also assisted in ministry to community and clergy during Central Florida's own recovery from Hurricane Irma.

But an ongoing need exists, he said, with the influx of more than 250,000 transplanted Puerto Ricans displaced by Hurricane Maria. Brewer emphasized how relief work can fulfill Christ's words, "I was hungry and you gave Me food. ... I was naked and you clothed Me."

Growing in Leadership

The Episcopal Diocese of Central Florida also saw 31 ordinations in 2017, including more young adults and women than in the past, said Brewer, who also emphasized the group's racial diversity. The diocese has students at various seminaries, its Timothy Fund providing financial help for aspiring priests. The Institute for Christian Studies (ICS) continues to improve vocational training for deacons and make it more accessible through online classes.

Moving in Missions

Brewer also highlighted God's work in reaching diocesan neighborhoods via food distribution and other relief, numerous new and creative services, ministry to the LGBTQ community, and countless other mission efforts. He stressed the need to examine whether these ministries move people to faith in Jesus Christ, reiterating the Great Commission's call to "go and make disciples of all nations."

In that light, Brewer said, new church plants are beginning or planned for Lake Nona, Horizon West, and The Villages. The Fresh Expressions movement, with its emphasis on new forms of church, is also growing. In areas where the population is declining, however, some congregations may close.

Reaching the Youth

On a positive note, diocesan youth ministries, Brewer said, increased in number this past year from 46 to 68, thanks especially to a partnership with the Youth Ministry Institute (YMI), where Kirsten Knox has replaced Steve Schneebecker as regional director. Rev. Bill Yates will serve as Camp Wingmann's interim director, with J.J. Joseph on board to oversee summer camps. Brewer has also worked to strengthen relationships with Episcopal schools, especially Holy Trinity Academy in Melbourne and Trinity Prep in Winter Park. Brewer expressed his appreciation for the work of the Central Florida Episcopal Schools Association (CFESA) under the leadership of Mr. Paul Garcia, Head of St. Barnabas Episcopal School in DeLand.

Praying for Discernment

Next, Brewer emphasized his need for counsel and prayer as he seeks God's missionary strategy for the diocese. Three ministry areas, he said, require special guidance: church plants and existing churches, the exploding Hispanic population, and the growing gay population.

Because of a lack of unity, the third area offers a special challenge, Brewer said. His charge as a bishop means his decisions must be coherent with the "faith of the apostles," take into consideration any action's impact on the "faith, unity and discipline of the Church," and be coherent with his global leadership responsibility.

For these reasons and after obtaining wise counsel, Brewer chose not to bring two proposed resolutions on LGBTQ issues, including same-sex marriage, to the Convention floor. Emphasizing his desire to avoid divisiveness, he announced plans for a theologically diverse task force to address these concerns. Chaired by Canon Justin Holcomb, the group will report on its findings at the 2019 Convention.

Impacting the Future

Brewer also spoke with fondness of his friendship with Bishop Lloyd Allen of Central Florida's partner diocese in Honduras, unable to leave his country due to political unrest. Requesting prayer for Allen and his people, Brewer noted that nearly all the bishops in Province 9 (Central/South America) remain opposed to the passage of gay marriage liturgies.

Genuine inclusion, Brewer said, has been thwarted by the denomination's commitment to majority rule and would be more adequately reflected by acknowledging differences in theology, geography, and culture and moving toward a consensus. Working the political system, he said, "doesn't look like the church of the New Testament to me." Instead, Brewer charged attendees to embrace their neighborhoods with prayer, wise counsel and genuine inclusion, acknowledging, "Our help is in the name of the Lord, maker of heaven and earth."

"We are here to serve together," Brewer said. "Let's do it."
