## A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

Epiphany often gets lost in the shuffle of Christmas and the New Year. It celebrates the three wise men (literally, *magi* – astrologers, not kings) who came to visit the baby Jesus, at first glance not a central event in the Gospel, even though it is the subject of a beloved carol. Yet, as well known as it is, only Matthew (Matthew 2:1-15) tells us of this event



and that alone is astonishing when we consider the backdrop of this little visit.

Matthew is probably the most "Jewish" of the Gospels, in its content, vocabulary and even in its structure. But it is Matthew who wants us to see that, right from the moment of Jesus' birth, He is for all the nations, not just for Israel. Of course, all the Gospels make this point in varying ways, but it is Matthew who draws it out so vividly at Jesus' birth with the visit, and worship, of these *magi* from a foreign land.

The celebration of Epiphany is really a celebration of Jesus revealed to all nations, and given for all nations. And that includes us. When we celebrate Epiphany, we celebrate the gift of Jesus to all people, and to us!

With that, let me encourage your participation in our annual Epiphany Celebration on Sunday, January 6 at 7 p.m. Other area Episcopal Churches will also be participating. Fr. Garry Edwards, Rector of St. Sebastians, Melbourne Beach, will be our preacher and Fr. Dee Bright, the new Rector of the Church of Our Savior, Palm Bay, will be our celebrant, along with mass choir from several area churches.

A second event I want to draw your attention to is our Diocesan Revival coming on Friday, Feb. 1 in Orlando. There is a large ad about this elsewhere in this "Good News" with all the details, but I'd like to reflect for a moment on the theme for the Revival: "Keep saying 'Yes' to Jesus!" I have no special insight on what Presiding Bishop Michael Curry might say about this, but I can say something about what it brings up for me.

Being a follower of Jesus is not a "once and done" proposition. You don't get your card punched at Baptism, then stick it in your wallet or your safety deposit box, until needed at your death. That would be like thinking that a marriage is all done once the ceremony is over. That is only the beginning! **Continued on Page 2...** 

There are many pressures in our society that draw us to say 'yes' to lots of other things, other priorities. Some are good and worthy. Others, not so much. Our faith calls us to keep choosing love and service over hate and selfishness; people over things; community over isolation; worship over arrogance. These choices are not always easy and need to be constantly repeated, otherwise our choices drift. Indeed, if we do not continually remind ourselves that Jesus is our choice, and the umbrella under which we make all other choices, we will drift.

The Revival promises to be a wonderful time both to be encouraged in saying 'yes' to Jesus, but also inviting people to say that first 'yes' to Jesus. Come and bring a friend!

There will be sign up sheet in the parish hall so we can get a handle on how many are planning to go and whether it makes sense to try to organize group transportation.

The vestry has agreed on some changes and clarifications regarding the handling of Memorial Flower gifts. These may take the form either of a memorial for someone who has passed away, or an expression of thanksgiving for some blessing of God.

First, rather than mixing the funds with the general operating budget, as has been the practice, all money donated for memorial flowers will go into a restricted fund. An added advantage is that the Flower Guild will know exactly how much they have to work with. Generally, flower gifts have significantly exceeded what has been spent on flowers (due to the hard work and creativity of our flower guild!), so at a later time, we may need to address how to handle excess funds as they begin to accumulate.

Second, we have not had any policy on what the minimum donation would be. At the suggestion of the Flower Guild, we have agreed that \$30 will now be the minimum contribution for a Sunday flower memorial. Requests for specific types of flowers may require a higher donation. We believe this is at the low end of what other congregations ask.

The Christmas Poinsettia Memorials and Easter Lily Memorials will continue to have no minimum so that everyone can participate regardless of finances.

Third, on occasion we have requests for more than one flower memorial on a given Sunday. In the past, it has generally worked out that there would not be multiple memorials, and this has led to an expectation that memorials should be exclusive, although this was never stated or promised. Both the flower guild and the vestry are in agreement that flower memorials are not exclusive and there may be more than one memorial on any particular Sunday. Therefore, if a second memorial request comes in for a Sunday, this will be accepted and there will be two (or more) memorials listed in the bulletin.

It is hoped that this will lead to greater consistency and less confusion about this important way to continue to express our love for those who have gone before, or as we give thanks for God's many blessings.

# Family Promise Growing in Brevard

St. John's can be extremely proud of our role in the tremendous success and growth of Family Promise of Brevard over the past two plus years we have served as a host church. FPOB has expanded significantly as evidenced by additional host churches and increased support from community leaders and businesses.

When we hosted our first families in June 2017, we became the thirteenth host church, a minimum number. As we begin 2019 there are 17 host churches. This means not every church hosts four times a year and that is the case for St. John's this year. We are hosting February 10-17, May 19-26 and October 13-20. Our success and that of other churches in concert with the FPOB staff has led to increased awareness of the huge problem of family homelessness in Brevard County. FPOB has promoted one temporary employee to full time status for the Help Us Move In prevention program and added three interns. When FPOB lost \$65,000 in government grants for 2019, the community stepped up with terrific support for the November Golf Fundraiser netting close to \$90,000. The August Annual Appeal netted \$40,000. Sheriff Wayne Ivey is making two promotional videos for the Emerald City 5K fundraiser. Other local businesses are adding and increasing support. All this means more opportunity for homeless family support.

The statistics continue to impress: Over the last five years 384 people have been helped through the shelter (host) program for an average stay of 37 days versus the national average of 60-65 days. The biggest issue continues to be finding affordable housing for those families eligible to graduate from the shelter program. FPOB is working very hard on this with potential landlords.

On the down side, the County Commissioners reduced FPOB funding form 28K to 5K (roads taking priority). FPOB is preparing a one-page letter for constituents to send to their commissioner to emphasize the value of FPOB to the community. We expect each of us to have the opportunity to send a copy to their commissioner when it is available. Hopefully, the Commissioners will restore all or part of the funding for 2019 and/or consider FPOB for funding in future years.

St. John's is very blessed to be a part of this growing program. However, we are very thin on volunteers especially dinner hosts and overnight hosts. If you wish to volunteer, please see Lee Steininger or Steve Manzer. See article elsewhere for details.

# **School of Healing Prayer**

Praying and praying for one another are essential to the Christian life. Yet there is so much more that God can do in our lives through prayer! Indeed, healing prayer as a way to allow God to address and heal many burdens we carry is a tremendous gift, but there is much to learn and do if we are to take advantage of what God has given us.

### **Vestry Notes for November and December 2018**

St. John's Vestry met on **November 29 at 7 p.m.** October Financials were discussed and are summarized below. Discussions were held on flower memorial policies, which are summarized elsewhere in this "Good News", as well as discussions regarding how we handle scheduling conflicts when a member funeral request conflicts with an existing commitment to an outside group for use of the facility. A restricted fund for flowers was established. A nominating committee to seek candidates for election to the vestry was formed, to be chaired by Hal Martin, Sr. Warden. An opportunity to rent St. James' House is being pursued. Offers to purchase a portion of the open land at the west end of the property are also being considered.

The December meeting was held on **December 20 at 7 p.m.** November financials were discussed and are summarized below. The vestry began discussions of the book "Canoeing the Mountains" by Tod Bolsinger, which considers the reality that dramatic shifts in our culture will also dramatically shift how the church operates in the future. A key observation is that the ground behind us looks nothing like the ground ahead of us and that church will need new adaptations and skills to proclaim the gospel effectively in this new context. Delegates to Diocesan Convention will be Anneke Bertsch, Ben Kendall and Lee Steininger.

# Facility Use and Funerals

Concern has been expressed about how the church handles commitments to outside group events when they are in conflict with a member's funeral. This came up when a recent member funeral was at the same time as an outside group had an event planned for the parish hall. This is the first time we have had a conflict with an outside group commitment in Fr. Eric's 14-year tenure here. While this is a very rare occurrence, it is important that these situations be handled well and that all understand the principles involved.

Following a lengthy discussion, it was agreed (with two dissenting votes) to continue the current unwritten policy that once a part of the facility has been committed to a group, it will not be canceled. It was recognized that it creates an unworkable situation for groups using the facility if they are told that they could be canceled at the last minute even after they have planned and prepared their event, and that this would, in fact, be quite inhospitable. Every effort will be made to accommodate both the outside group and the member's funeral needs, but we will not cancel the group's event.


