A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

We live in a culture that wants instant and easy gratification. Want some info? Don't drive to the library, google it on your smartphone. Hungry? There's a drive through on every corner. Now we don't even have to wait a week for the next episode of our favorite TV series. Just binge it online!



In March, we begin the forty day season of Lent. By today's standards, it seems a long time to be in a season of penitence and fasting. Forty days! If you think that's a long time, when the church began observing Lent it was three years!

Originally, Lent served two major purposes: First, new converts to the faith were trained and discipled in the faith, and, second, those who had been excommunicated for notorious sin were prepared for re-admission to the fellowship of the church. In both cases, this was a three year period! It was believed this was needed to allow adequate time for teaching, proper amendment of life, and for the church to be confident that the life changes attested had taken root in the candidate.

Following the conversion of the Roman Emperor Constantine in about 300 AD, it became fashionable and even necessary to become a Christian. This dramatic shift meant huge numbers of 'converts' beating on the doors of the church, and there was no longer a fear of bringing in fake converts who might report the Christians to the authorities. People had no patience for a three year preparation, and eventually, it was shortened to forty days, paralleling Jesus' time of temptation and struggle in the wilderness (see Matthew 4:1-11 and Luke 4:1-13).

There are some things that just take time and changing the human heart is one of them. Real, meaningful and lasting life-change is one of the most difficult things for us to accomplish. Witness the number of New Year's Resolutions that have already been abandoned, perhaps to be resurrected again next year. But to make changes real and embed them in our lives takes time, and lots of it. There is no quick or easy fix for the human heart.

As we move through this season of Lent, be thankful for the gift of time. Don't be surprised if new Lenten disciplines don't immediately take hold and become second nature. Give God the time to accomplish His work in you. He won't be done tomorrow. He won't even be done when you take your last breath. But He will complete it! Remember the words of Paul to the church at Philippi, "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ." (Philippians 1:6) And that could be awhile!

Please check the Sunday Ministries schedule to see what ministries are needed. Thank you!



Our Family Promise (FP) team hosted two families February 10 - 17, the first of three hostings this year. It was a huge success. Both families are now in housing or will be very soon. This reflects the great job Family Promise of Brevard continues to do for homeless families in Brevard County.



After only one night with us, a family of three moved into their new home. The second family stayed with us the entire week. They are a delightful family of five; sons Justin, 10, Jalen, 7 and daughter Selena, 5, were a lot of fun. The family has a home waiting and with a favorable inspection will move in the week of February 18! That's two for two and that is the Family Promise objective.

Our FP team is truly impressive. Hope Johnson, our Food Captain, not only schedules people to prepare dinners for each of seven nights, she is there every night to welcome the families after a trying day (regardless of how tough her day has been), sees the families have lunches for the following day, and helps clean up. Amazing!

Steve Manzer schedules the overnight hosts which is a daunting task, one of our most difficult. Not only does he get it done, but if necessary, he schedules himself multiple times to insure coverage. True dedication and devotion.

Linda Fletcher, our Set up and Tear Down Captain was scheduled to be out of town, but she didn't let that keep her from accomplishing her FP responsibilities. She left detailed instructions for her team, did some of the preliminary work herself, and returned to help her team tear down. Incredible!

Deacon Elizabeth, our Saturday Captain, has a full team to cover all day Saturday when the families have a day off and there is never a time slot that goes unfilled. Simply terrific!

St. John's is blessed to have a dedicated team. We have two more hostings this year; May and October. We have openings for new volunteers regardless of any limitations. Join us. It takes little time and the reward is indescribable. When you see two for two, it doesn't get any better.

School of Healing Prayer

When Jesus had called the Twelve together, he gave them power and authority to drive out all demons and to cure diseases, and he sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick. **Luke 9: 1-2**



Praying and praying for one another are essential to the Christian life. Yet there is so much more that God can do in our lives through prayer! Indeed, healing prayer as a way to allow God to address and heal many burdens we carry is a tremendous gift, but there is much to learn and do if we are to take advantage of what God has given us.

St. John's has successfully completed our first Level 1 class in the School of Healing Prayer. Level 2 will be offered in a retreat format April 25-27.

Level 1 will be offered again, this time on Thursday evenings, beginning September 12, 2019. This course will be offered to other churches and denominations in the Melbourne area.

Vestry Notes for January 2019

Please note that the publishing deadline did not allow the inclusion of the February meeting and related information. Financial summary is included below, which is also the 2018 year-end report. The year-end deficit of \$3,620 was covered from the Restricted Reserve account. After deducting this amount and adding in the \$4,000 moved from the Insurance Deductible fund, the balance is \$8,441 in the Restricted Reserve.

A number of years ago, a Restricted Fund account for "insurance deductible" was established with prior surplus annual funds of \$4,000. As new Fire and Liability insurance has a substantially reduced deductible, this amount was moved to the Restricted Reserve account, used to help cover potential deficits.

2018 Outreach was \$9,950.45.

The pledge count stands at 57 for a total amount of \$167,955. Givers of Record amount is \$24,191 (those who give regularly, but do not turn in a pledge card). Total: \$192,146 for 2019. A few pledge forms remain out.

The possible lease of James House was discussed and as of the meeting we were awaiting responses from the City of Melbourne regarding zoning.

Materials are being prepared to obtain Diocesan approval for the sale of a portion of St. John's property at the west end of the parking area between Young St. and Shady Ln.

St. John's Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish meeting was called to order with prayer on Sunday, Feb. 3 at 9 a.m. Five Vestry candidates: Anneke Bertsch, Teresa Chernault, Kathy Hoffman, Hope Johnson, and Joe McLaughlin were introduced The elected Vestry members are Teresa Chernault, Hope Johnson, and Joe McLaughlin.

Jr. Warden Kathy Oas prepared a detailed report and it is available for review. Major projects completed in 2018: installed new red carpet in the sanctuary; replaced the air conditioner servicing the office, 2 large lightening-damaged trees in the vicinity of the Memorial Garden were removed. She thanked all those who volunteered to assist in these activities, including Ray McClendon, Lee Steininger, Bob and Dennis Stitzel, Bill and Teresa Chernault, Richard Huffman, Laure Bennett, and Eric Turner.

The Treasurer, Steve Bradley, reported financials for the year ending December 31, 2018. See the summary with the Vestry Notes. The fiscal year ended with a deficit of \$3,620.

The 2019 budget includes \$215,000 revenues (\$6,000 more than 2018 actual revenues), \$215,000 expenses (\$2,000 more than 2018 actual expenses) with no deficit or reserve planned. Budgeted revenue increases come from new pledges, anticipated rental income from James House and miscellaneous income, budgeted expense increases are mostly due to the change in giving to the Diocese from 10% to 12%.

The 2019 Stewardship Drive resulted in 57 Pledges for a total of \$167,955, the average monthly pledge amount of \$2,946 with 40% of the pledges less than \$1,500 per month. Steve extended special thanks to Anneke Bertsch, assistant treasurer, Carole Taylor, bookeeper, and the Sunday counters: Ginny Bradley, Ben Kendall, and Katie Wilson.

Ben Kendall presented his thoughts on the Diocesan Convention held Saturday Feb 2, preceded by the Diocesan Revival with Presiding Bishop Michael Curry in Orlando. The theme for the convention, and the year, is Keep Saying 'Yes' to Jesus. Ben described the events as spirit-filled, uplifting, and informative.

Lee Steininger presented results from the 2018 St. John's hosting activities with Family Promise of Brevard. Fifteen families comprising 24 adults and 40 children were hosted. Of the 15 families, 12 have achieved housing. The average length of time a family is in the program is 38 days.

lan Johnson reported on St. John's continuing work two days a month with Daily Bread.

Fr. Eric thanked parishioners St. John's staff and volunteers for their productive work in 2018. As time ran out, the meeting was adjourned and picked up again on February 10 at 9 a.m. Fr. Eric reviewed the activities around St. John's property from past to current. Key points: (1) the park, having emotional value is not under consideration for sale; (2) Active efforts to rent James House are underway, (3) The Vestry is actively pursuing sale of some of the property west of the church building. Two offers, \$125,000 an \$150,000 have been made. A detailed proposal to the Diocese is being finalized outlining the rationale for selling the property and how income from the sale would be used, and specifically that it will not go to general operating expenses. Funds would be used for a variety of capital projects and to secure a professional consultant to identify the steps to grow and achieve a sustainable future for St. John's.

Fr. Eric described steps the Vestry has taken over the last 12 months, educating on the current state of American churches, the challenges of a fast-paced changing culture, and what must be embraced to become and remain relevant now and in the future. The Vestry is reading and discussing the book, Canoeing The Mountains, at the recommendation of Bishop Brewer and Canon Nunez.

We are faced with a landscape much different than that which church leaders were trained to navigate and that most of us grew up in. We must no longer look to existing members to describe what they need, but look to those not currently attending church for answers. The tools needed to navigate change are still not fully defined but we know it does not simply mean doing more of what 'I like'. We are trying to answer the questions, "What type of leadership is needed and what does the model of leadership look like for an undertaking into unknown but undeniable change?"

We know we must re-tool to give ourselves and others the experience of God.


