#### A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

I don't believe that I have ever quoted Ellen DeGeneres, but here goes. Ellen was at a Dallas Cowboys football game having been invited to the owner's suite by the daughter of the owner of the Cowboys. She happened to be sitting next to former President George W. Bush, also a guest of the owner, and a picture was tweeted out of the two of them laughing together. Many who would see her as a champion of gay rights and a liberal social agenda were critical of her being seen with him. She responded on her talk show the following week:



"I'm friends with George Bush. In fact, I'm friends with a lot of people who don't share the same beliefs that I have. We're all different and I think we've forgotten that that's OK . . . just because I don't agree with someone on everything doesn't mean that I'm not going to be friends with them. When I say 'Be kind to one another,' I don't mean only the people that think the same way that you do. I mean be kind to everyone."

I actually believe that kindness is a vastly underrated virtue. When we think of virtues, we generally think of grander things like wisdom, discipline, self-sacrifice, generosity and so on. But I believe that simple kindness is the grease that keeps the wheels of relationships moving and is essential to a life honoring to God.

I have quoted Gandalf (the great, ancient wizard), from The Hobbit by J. R. R. Tolkein, and I'll quote him again. (In fact, I had this on the church Facebook page recently.)

"Some believe it is only great power that can hold evil in check. But that is not what I have found. I have found that it is the small, everyday deeds of ordinary folk that keep the darkness at bay. Small acts of kindness and love."

Especially in a season when there is so much anger and division percolating in our culture, it is all the more important that we remember to simply be kind. When it seems that social media "influencers," celebrities, politicians and others create storms with a Tweet or Instagram post and then other trolls are only too happy to jump on the bandwagon of cynicism, bitterness and vitriol, we need to remember that we should not look for some alternative "influencer" to fix the problem. That won't happen. What really matters over the long haul is you and me, ordinary folk, remembering to simply be kind and loving to one another.

#### Scripture teaches us the same thing:

"And be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you." Ephesians 4:32

"She opens her mouth with wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue." Proverbs 31:26

"Love is patient; love is kind." I Corinthians 13:4

"Whoever pursues righteousness and kindness will find life and honor." Proverbs 21:21

"The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." Galatians 5:22

"As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience." Colossians 3:12

I could go on, but I think you get the idea. Let me add two other thoughts. Kindness is not just for those who are kind to us. The virtue of kindness is no virtue if only extended to those to whom it is easy to be kind. We should extend kindness to all because it is part of our character, not because of their character.

Second, kindness is not just for those times when we can be seen. One of the grave dangers of the internet, and social media in particular, is the temptation to let the nasty side come out when we are alone and it feels that we are not accountable for what we say. Be kind even when no one will know who you are!

Where could you learn to be a little kinder?




## **Converge:** Our Joint Youth Ministry

## **Lots of Family Promise Doings**

Family Promise of Brevard continues to do a great job of sheltering homeless families while the families find employment and housing. St. John's is extremely proud to be a part of this team. This year marks our third year as a host church and we are scheduled for three hostings in 2020; March 1-7, May 31-June 7, and December 27-January 3, 2021.



October and November are busy months for the St. John's Family Promise team with a hosting week October 13-20 and November 2nd is the annual Family Promise of Brevard Golf Scramble and Ball Drop at Indian River Colony Club, Viera.

We have enough volunteers to get the hosting job done, but continue to rely on some volunteers taking on two tasks each hosting to do it. The tasks are not difficult; there is no cost, and the time required is minimal and doesn't involve normal day time working hours. Staying overnight one night in the parish hall, preparing a meal or a dish either at home or in the parish hall kitchen one evening, or a couple of hours at the parish hall on a Saturday or Sunday is about it. The Golf Scramble and Helicopter Ball Drop is a lot of fun and a great way to support Family Promise. This year St. John's has two foursomes in the Scramble. We have a goal of selling \$600 worth of golf balls. All information for buying balls is in the parish hall and online at www.familypromiseofbrevard.com. The golf balls are dropped from the helicopter at low level at a flag on the golf course and closest to the pin wins \$2500. Second place is \$500.00. You don't have to be present to win. A great, fun way to support this very worthy ministry.


### **Vestry Notes**

The Vestry met on Thursday, September 19. Steve Bradley presented the finance report for the month ending August 31, 2019. See summary figures below. The year to date deficit, is \$6,214 compared to a budgeted year to date deficit of \$4,239. Kathy Oas reported the September Work Party went well and all tasks were completed. In addition, the fenced area behind the nursery was cleaned up, fence removed, and the ground can be mowed as part of the regular ground mowing. New outdoor carpet leading up to the sanctuary was installed - the cost of which was donated by a parishioner. A Christmas mailer to the local neighborhood will be sent again with funds raised from the congregation. The Vestry reviewed new findings which came to light com-pared to the original contract. The actual number of lots in the property to be considered for sale is 4, not 6. This changes the sale price to \$100,000 and the buyer absorbs all closing costs. The church is applying for a variance to allow the one platted lot on Shady Ln to be developed as two 50 ft. lots (to match surrounding development). A motion was made, seconded, and approved to proceed with the sale based on 4 lots at \$100,000 and based on assumption request for variance is accepted by the city. Hal Martin will chair the nominating committee to identify and recruit candidates to run.

The Vestry met again on Thursday, October 17. September financial summary is below. The 2018 Audit Report was accepted. Thanks to Steve Bradley and Ben Kendall for handling this. Kathy Oas reported that a new AC unit has been installed in the altar guild sacristy by the Stitzels and a new water heater was donated and installed by Hambel plumbing to serve the parish hall, kitchen and bathrooms. Hal Martin reported that there are 2 confirmed candidates for vestry elections in January. More are being pursued. A Proposed Budget for 2020 was presented by Steve Bradley and was approved by the vestry with minor modifications. This will be used in the fall stewardship campaign. It is anticipated that we will close on the sale of the 2 ½ lots on the Young Street side of the property before the holidays so we will need to begin to make firm plans for the use of those funds. Three delegates are needed for the 2020 Diocesan Convention. Members were asked to be considering whether they might want to do this.
