A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

The beginning of the year is a good time to return to the basics. What is it that makes us who we are? Are we really living out the values and commitments we claim to hold dear? I would encourage you to ask these questions for yourselves, but we also should ask them as a church family. So, as a refresher, here is our church Mission, Values and Vision, along with some comments. While the vestry reviews this every year, the current version



was adopted December 15, 2016. The official statements are in italics and my comments are in plain type.

St. John's Mission

St. John's is a worshiping community, obedient to scripture, growing as servants of Christ, and sharing His love in word and deed.

First, we are a **community.** We recognize that as the body of Christ, we are bound to one another. When one rejoices, all rejoice. When one suffers all suffer. The church is not a club of individual people, but a living community bound together in Christ. The primary act of the community that binds and identifies us is worship. "Worship" means to grant worth to something other than ourselves. We offer our worship to God as understood in the Christian tradition, in the Creeds and in our Book of Common Prayer.

We are obedient to **Scripture.** This does not mean that we have all the answers, but we believe God has given us, in the Scriptures, all we need to know to live a life pleasing to Him and edifying to one another. Therefore, we "read, mark, learn and inwardly digest,"

the Scriptures and seek to pattern our lives, both individually and corporately, in accord with what we learn there.

Ultimately, the only **growth** that truly matters is that we grow as servants of Christ. We do not seek big budgets or notoriety in the community but to serve Christ wherever and however He may send us. That call may be easy and near, or difficult and far, but that is the growth we seek.

We have nothing to offer the world but the **love of Christ.** We do not have our own wisdom or cleverness. We do not have easy answers to difficult questions. What we have dependably and what we share freely is the love that Jesus has poured out on us. And we share that love in both word and deed. To speak of the love of Christ without action is empty and cheapens His love. To act in love without speaking of Jesus robs others of the opportunity to know Him themselves and become part of that serving community.

St. John's Core Values

We are Biblical Christians, acting in all matters with integrity, serving others before ourselves, and striving for excellence in all we do.

This emphasizes the theme that we are obedient to Scripture but says a bit more about how we seek to live out that obedience. We strive to do so with integrity, meaning that we integrate all aspects of our lives into our Christian life and service. Faith is not just for when we are at church, but for all arenas of our lives. Serving others takes priority over our own ease and comforts. We strive for excellence in our service to God as we serve one another. Excellence demonstrates the value we place on one another and on the God whom we serve.

We are members of the Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion.

The Anglican Communion is a global fellowship of Christians having its roots in the Christian Church in England. Today, there are 38 'Provinces' of the Anglican Communion around the world and St. John's is part of the Province known as The Episcopal Church, comprising churches in the United States, plus Colombia, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Haiti, Honduras, Puerto Rico, Taiwan, Venezuela, the Virgin Islands and some English language churches throughout western Europe known as the Convocation of Episcopal Churches in Europe.

We worship within the Anglican tradition.

Worship within the Anglican tradition means primarily that we have a liturgical style of worship in which the congregation is invited and encouraged to participate in the act of worship. Worship is not something done by the priest at the altar, but by the gathered community. We have forms and patterns by which we do that so that even a newcomer can be a participant should they wish.

St. John's Vision

With God's help, We reach out to our community to meet human need and invite others to St. John's.

This emphasizes again our commitment to sharing the love of Christ in both word and deed. We work to meet the needs that we find in our community and beyond and as we do so, we invite others into this community.

We endeavor to be disciples of Jesus Christ, providing our members opportunities for spiritual growth, learning and service.

To be a disciple is to give oneself over to the training and mentoring of another with the goal of becoming like that "master." We identify our "master" as Jesus and we work to provide a variety of ways to grow in that discipleship.

We enrich our worship to provide a more uplifting experience for all and to attract new members.

Recognizing the central role of worship, and in line with out commitment to excellence, we work to make our worship as uplifting and engaging as we can. We conduct our worship in such a way to both engage and edify our regular members and also to be attractive and engaging for new members and first time visitors.


Outreach Focus January

Family Promise Adds to Successes

The week of 13-20 October 2019 completed three years of St. John's hosting homeless families under the Family Promise of Brevard program. During those



three years we have hosted 28 families totaling 97 adults and children. The FPOB overall success rate for families finding stable housing is over 85% and the October hosting contributed to that impressive number.

Our October hosting approached the maximum number allowed by Family Promise with four families and thirteen people (four and 14 being the max). We had a family of five in the nursery, three in the Flower house, two in the parish hall and two in the chapel. Phew! Our Family Promise team was up to this daunting task and the week went extremely well. Most importantly, while the families were with us, one family found housing, one family stabilized employment so they could actively look for housing, one family has since found employment to begin the stabilizing process, and the fourth has steady employment and is looking for housing. This is a magnificent success story and we were a direct part of it. Our team can be very proud of the contributions we are making to helping homeless families achieve a stable home environment.

In the meantime, we contributed significantly to the Family Promise Golf Scramble fundraiser in November. Many of you bought golf balls for the helicopter ball drop and we met our goal of \$600 in ball purchases. We also had two foursomes in the scramble itself. The total raised was over @100,00.00! It is contributions like this that give Family Promise the capability to do the work necessary to help eradicate family homelessness. The next opportunity for us to make a contribution is the Emerald City 5K walk/run on February 28, 2020. Fliers are in the parish hall so please take one and help with this critical ministry.

Finally, we enter our fourth year of hosting on March 1, 2020. The Family Promise motto is "You Are The Key" and it is so true. Despite our relatively small size, St. John's is doing a super job supporting Family Promise, but it takes many volunteers, and yes, you are the key! We need all hands on deck to accomplish this ministry and we have something for everyone regardless of health, age, work schedules etc. We need you.

Vestry Notes

The Vestry met on Thursday, November 21, 2019. Steve Bradley presented the Treasurer's report for the period ending October 31, 2019. The financial result were revenues \$4,027 less than budget and expenses \$526 less than budget. The month ended with deficit of \$3,755. The deficit for the year to date is \$8,964 the bulk of which is attributable to collected pledge dollars is less than amounts that were pledged at the beginning of the fiscal year.

The Vestry spent the bulk of the meeting time discussing the financials and their implications. A plan for speaker presentations at future services was created in order to keep parishioners informed. Hal Martin, Senior Warden, updated the Vestry on identifying candidates for the three Vestry positions to be vacated in January. He and his committee continue to speak to interested parties. Kathy Oas thanked Joe McLaughlin for his talent and treasure contribution to fixing a leaky toilet in the nursery.

Scott Holcombe, Diocesan Canon to the Ordinary, will attend the December Vestry meeting, to learn more, from the Vestry, about the challenges St. John's faces and to begin a long term consultation process.

The next Vestry meeting will be held Thursday, December 19th at 7p.m. Due to deadlines for completing and printing this newsletter prior to Christmas, the December Vestry meeting is not covered and will appear in the next Good News.


Treasurer's Year End Forecast

December 15, 2019

The last report for St. John's financial status was in the November Good News and stated our Operating budget had a \$5k deficit. Unfortunately, the month of October had an unexpected drop in income of around \$4k which drove our November Year to Date deficit to be \$9k. At the last Vestry meeting it was unanimously agreed the parish should be apprised of our current situation. The month of December has historically been a financial surplus month of \$3-4k which means St. John's would end the year with a \$5-6k deficit.

Awhile ago all pledgers received a statement of their contribution status. Please review your contributions and fulfilling your pledge will go a long way in reducing our deficit. Additionally, if any parishioners have had a good year financially, please contribute one more weeks' worth of your annual giving to ensure St John's will finish the year strongly going into 2020.
