A WORD FROM THE RECTOR


Dear Friends,

At the begining of February in the Sunday sermon I mentioned what I have often talked of as the key elements to the healthy Christian life, and I made a change:

- 1) Worship both gathering for public worship with other Christians, and our own private worship, turning our attention to God in prayer and praise.
- 2) Scripture reading the Bible both together and on our own, even if we don't understand everything we read. Let the Word pour over you, trusting that the Holy Spirit will work in you beyond even what you might understand.
- 3) Fellowship and support gather with other Christians to know, support and encourage one another.
- 4) Service beyond yourself that may take lots of different shapes at different times in our lives, but we should always be about the business of sacrificially caring for others by whatever means are available to us.

And I added a 5th:

5) Invitation — it is not enough to be satisfied with our own, private Christian faith that brings us comfort, hope, healing and strength. If we are not actively seeking to draw others into that faith community, to faith in Christ, then we are just keeping the blessings to ourselves and that is a truncated faith.



Lent is a season that turns us inward, to observing a holy Lent by "self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word." But this inward looking season is not so that we might stay that way. Lent turns us inward so that come Easter, we are prepared to turn outward in the glorious acclamation of Easter: "Alleluia! Christ is risen!"

For some, this drive to invitation (dare I call it 'evange-lism'?) comes naturally. For others, we have to work at it. Like all the other elements of the Christian life, there is a time to focus on each one. We do not do all five at full throttle all the time, but we should be sure that each one has a place in our Christian life.

I would also note that this is not simply an exercise in doing what is already comfortable. If you find worship easy and comfortable, then perhaps it is a season for you to focus on Bible study. If service comes easily to you, then perhaps worship. If small groups make you uncomfortable, maybe it is time for you to discipline yourself to give a small group a try.

Whatever the Lord is nudging you to work on, take it on this Lent not simply to have a more satisfying and fulfilling Christian walk but to grow into new challenges, new opportunities and new growth come Easter!

The meeting was called to order Sunday, January 26, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. by Father Eric.

Outgoing vestry and officers were thanked for their service. The 4 Vestry candidates, Anneke Bertsch, Linda Fletcher, Penny Perian, and Katie Wilson were introduced. The elected Vestry members are Linda Fletcher, Penny Perian, and Katie Wilson.

Kathy Oas prepared a detailed Jr. Warden's report and it is available for review.

The Treasurer, Steve Bradley, reported financials for the year ending December 31, 2019. The fiscal year ended with a deficit of \$4,034. The 2020 budget is \$214,000 and

is balanced. The 2020 Stewardship Drive resulted in 58 Pledges for a total of \$170,420, the average monthly pledge amount of \$2,938. Detailed reports are available upon request. Steve extended special thanks to Anneke Bertsch, assistant treasurer, Carol Taylor, bookkeeper, and the Sunday counters: Ginny Bradley, Ben Kendall, and Katie Wilson.

Fr. Eric reported the sale of the property is complete, the check has been received and deposited.

Jen Lester, Music Minister, and Hasty Miller presented an overview of the current state of the pipe organ. The pipes are in good shape but the console has multiple failures, which over time, are expected to increasingly limit the functionality of the organ. The Vestry expressed appreciation for the work and dollars Jen and Hasty have invested in this effort. The Vestry has encouraged Hasty to pursue bids and anticipates a fund raising effort to cover the anticipated costs once those figures are known.

Fr, Eric reflected he has been with St. John's for 16 years - the longest he has ever lived and served anywhere. He noted that culture change forces the church to change and this will be our greatest task for the upcoming years. We know we must re-tool to give ourselves and others the experience of God we gratefully find here. Finally, Fr. Eric thanked parishioners St. John's staff and volunteers for their productive work in 2019.


Loaning of Church Items

Ben Kendall takes Over as Family Promise Coordinator St. John's Hosts Family Promise First Week in March

Ben Kendall graciously and enthusiastically replaces Lee Steininger as St. John's Family Promise Coordinator for 2020 as Lee assumes responsibilities as Senior Warden.

Family Promise

We have three hostings scheduled for this year. The first hosting, Sunday, March 1, will see the arrival of up to four homeless, families and a maximum of 14 people, for a week's stay at St. John's under the auspices of the Family Promise of Brevard (FPOB) shelter program. This will mark our eleventh hosting overall as we begin our fourth year of hosting homeless families. Over the first three years, we have hosted 30 families, totaling 120 people with 87% finding housing and achieving stability in an average of only 38 days. That is an amazingly successful program!

The families will be housed in the "Yellow House" formerly known as the "Flower House", the nursery, the parish hall, and the chapel. Our host teams are already busy. The Set up/Tear Down Team is preparing to set up the PVC partitions in the parish hall after Sunday service on March 1. The team will also receive and set up a cot for each guest. The Food Team will provide a hot dinner, a continental breakfast, and a sack lunch daily, and the Overnight Team will host the families each night. Saturday is a free day for the families and we have a team of eight to ten volunteers who will host them that day.

The families will spend weekdays working at their jobs, in school, or searching for housing and jobs. Or they go to the FPOB Resource Center in Rockledge researching available housing and employment and meeting with the social workers.

It takes a large number of volunteers to accomplish this task and we are fortunate to have a dedicated congregation that has made it happen. However, we are short the number of volunteers needed to fill all requirements making it necessary for current volunteers to do several tasks. There is something for everyone regardless of skills or physical capability. Hearing God's Voice

Editor's Note: This article is by Dr. Jerry F. Davidson, a newer member of St. John's who has filled in on organ for us. Dr. Jerry attends with his wife, The Rev. Susan Davidson, a retired Episcopal priest. This article was published in the February 9, 2020 issue of The Living Church, a national, independent Episcopal weekly news magazine.

This is my Father's world, and to my listening ears All nature sings, and 'round me rings, the music of the spheres. This is my Father's world: I rest me in the thought Of rocks and trees, of skies and seas; his hand the wonders wrought.

This is my Father's world, the birds their carols raise, The morning light, the lily white, declare their maker's praise. This is my Father's world: he shines in all that's fair; In the rustling grass I hear him pass, He speaks to me everywhere. Maltbie D. Babcock, 1901.

Humans are never without sound. As I sit typing on a computer I am aware of the tick-tick of the timer that will remind me of a cooking chore, the sounds of my fingers depressing the keys, the continuous whoosh of the traffic some distance away, and the gentle sound of the wind through the nearby trees.

We are also bombarded by loud, persistent, and frantic sounds. Cars pass by with throbbing sound systems. Our attention is riveted by pings, alerts, videos, and GIFs on our phones. Our ears are stuffed with ear buds. Authentic communication shrivels in this over-noisy world. Exchanges happen most easily over text.

We believe that God spoke, sometimes audibly, to biblical peoples, and I believe that God continues to speak to us. We believe that God hears us when we pray, but have we failed to listen for him?

Careful listening as a skill was critical to primitive humanity. Auditory cues were often the difference between life and death. I often wonder when it was in the history of mankind that allowed us to begin to listen for pleasure. At what point did people begin to differentiate pitches and organize them? Who first beat on a hollow log, mimicking the "lub-dub" of the human heartbeat? Who made the first primitive flute? Who stretched a horsehair or catgut across a resonating body and plucked it? Or used the bow (minus its arrow) to sustain the sound?

After more than sixty years of being a musician, listening for pleasure has become a challenge. When it was a part of my job to go to concerts and recitals—sometimes as many as three a day—much of the pleasure evaporated. Now when I listen. I have to be very careful that I am not listening primarily to be critical. Even as a musician, I have to train and retrain myself for listening.

Many years ago a humor magazine offered "music to listen to records by." Now music has too often taken the function of white noise. It spurs us to shop longer, and energizes or relaxes us at work. But it is not listened to.

Yet there is also something almost "automatic" about music. Alzheimer's patients who can no longer recognize their loved ones can to sing many hymns from memory. I have taught generations of children the names of Jesus' twelve disciples and the books of the Old and New Testaments with simple songs. Some sounds, once ingrained, are easy to recall.

Being surrounded by sounds is not always negative. It depends on what they are and what effect they have. Do they sharpen us, connect us? Do they teach or transport? Or are they doing the opposite?

Listening for God

How can we separate the noise and turn our attention to the important sounds that sharpen our ear for God? The liturgy is a festival of such sounds (and silences). It enables our spiritual survival, and bringing joy and deep pleasure. As it permeates our minds and hearts by repetition, it teaches us God's ways and attunes us to God's voice. As a long-time church musician, I constantly ask, "How can we hear the voice of God in the liturgy?" Here are three pointers.

1. Attending to the readings

The archaic language of scripture can pose barriers, as can the reader's skills. Some parishes provide a printed copy of the text to help reduce the chance of distraction or mishearing. I think this is generally wise. With printed readings, worshipers are more likely to follow along closely as the lessons are read.

I prefer, though, only to listen, especially when the reader is one who can make the words come alive. The extra effort to listen with the ears and untether the eyes creates unique opportunity for inner illumination. Frequently as the lessons are being read, the words explode with meaning, and I hear God's word to me: an answer to a problem, a message of encouragement, consolation, or pure joy.

2. Attending to the music

I learned to play hymns at a very early age. They are a part of me. The lyrics have ministered to me at various crucial points in my life. We should never sing with more attention to the pitches and melody than the meaning of the words.

An interesting opportunity for listening arises when text and music don't agree. In Wagner's Ring cycle, only the use of leitmotivs tells us when Alberich, the dwarf, is lying. Noble ideas like "God is good," "love one another," or "peace on earth," can be minimized, diluted, or even negated by poor melodic construction, banal repetition, and minimal harmonic content.

Carefully considering the needs of one's audience is crucial for church musicians as they make decisions using music to help people listen to God. Worshippers may not be able to explain subtleties in tempo, key, texture, or medium, but God can still use them all to profound effect.

School of Healing Prayer

When Jesus had called the Twelve together, he gave them power and authority to drive out all demons and to cure diseases, and he sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick. **Luke 9: 1-2**

Vestry Notes

The January 16, 2020 meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Steve Bradley presented the finance report for the month and year ending December 31, 2019. Summary is below, details are available from the church office upon request. Steve Bradley distributed an updated 2020 budget based on the latest status of pledges and givers of records, and growth income reduced from \$2.4K to \$800. A motion was made to accept the 2020 budget as distributed. Detailed budget is available upon request.

The property sale was completed and the check received and deposited. Up to \$19,000 was approved from the sale proceeds for replacement of the roof the 'office square' coomprising the Rector's office, Deacon's office, Finance Office, Nursery, Bloom Room and others.
