A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

I recently read that the producers of the newest James Bond film were re-shooting some scenes because the cell phone Bond was using about 18 months ago looked outdated. In case we think this is a brand new phenomenon of technology, how fast did skirt lengths or tie widths change in years past? The "tyranny of novelty" is a cruel master because it is never satisfied and always requires the next thingamabob, the new color, the next purchase.



In some ways, there is a rebellion afoot. Millennials (roughly, those 22 to 38 years old now), when they go to church (pre-pandemic, anyway), are spurning the contemporary churches of their boomer parents and going for much more traditional forms of worship. But the general cultural obsession with novelty is undeniable.

Preachers are not immune to this. We want the latest program, the newest insight. This pressure is even stronger when so much is up in the air in the midst of a pandemic and social upheaval. When it comes to preaching on holidays like Christmas and Easter, we feel the pressure to come up with something new and shiny. One clergy friend has taken to writing a new fiction story every Christmas and has now published a book of them. But the reality is that constant novelty never satisfies. Its titillation lasts only until the next, slightly more glittery thing comes along.

Before I was ordained, I worked as a youth minister at a large parish in St. Louis. The Associate Rector that I worked with had long wanted a Jeep Cherokee. Finally, the time came for him to trade in his old car and he leased a new Cherokee. Initially, he was thrilled, but within a month, he confessed to me that he had gotten into a friend's Cherokee that had more bells and

whistles and he was already finding himself dissatisfied with the vehicle he had so long wanted.

The tyranny of novelty is not new. In the book of Acts, the author, Luke, with great disdain, wrote that "all the Athenians and the foreigners living there would spend their time in nothing but telling or hearing something new." (Acts 17:21) St. Paul warned that the time would come when "people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires." (2 Timothy 4:3) Are we there yet?

On the other hand, the church is about the Gospel. Not an ever-changing modern Gospel of flash and glitter, but the unchanging bedrock of Jesus and His love for us worked out on the cross and in the empty tomb. Remember the chorus of the old hymn?

I love to tell the story, 'twill be my theme in glory,

*To tell the old, old story of Jesus and His love. **

So, I'm going to make the choice this Easter season to be satisfied with the old, old story. I'm not going to get caught in the tyranny of novelty. I will join St. Paul who said, "I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified." (1 Corinthians 2:2) Let's celebrate Easter as a reminder of the unending truth of Jesus' death and resurrection at work in our lives today. Most of us need to be reminded of the basics pretty often anyway!

Annual Convention of the Diocese of Central Florida

The 2021 Annual Diocesan Convention was held Saturday, February 6. Due to COVID-19, the convention was entirely virtual conducted via Zoom. Elections were conducted via an application called 'Election Buddy'.

The business of the Convention - resolutions, elections, orders of business - went smoothly. Between elections and results, videos from diocesan parishes showcasing their works during and in spite of COVID, were informative and interesting. Presentations from the Bishop of Honduras highlighted the extreme peril brought on by multiple hurricanes, COVID-19, political strife and corruption, and crushing poverty.

The Bishop's message was built around the convention theme: Weaker/Stronger/Deeper. Bishop Brewer related pre-COVID activities which were abruptly curtailed. With COVID, the Diocese had to change directions and develop strategies to support the diocese in the 'new normal'. He spoke of God's work being both expressed and received in fresh ways.

Annual Parish Meeting

St. John's held the 2021 annual parish meeting on Sunday, February 7. It was conducted as a hybrid in-person attendance and Zoom. After the call to order and opening prayers, the 2021 Vestry candidates were introduced. A call for nominations from the floor went unanswered so the Vestry elections proceeded. After three election rounds, Skip Alcorn, Susan Bagio, and Deborah Miller-Caldwell were elected. Vestry members rotating off are Ben Kendall, Linda Miller, and Lee Steininger who were thanked for their service.

Detailed Reports from the Jr. and Sr. Warden are available; however Kathy Oas and Lee Steininger gave brief oral reports, including thanks to all who supported their efforts in 2020.

Steve Bradley, Treasurer, presented the 2020 Year End Financials and the 2021 Budget, which includes financial details for the Hispanic Mission. These reports are available on the St. John's website.

Jen Lester and Hasty Miller gave an update on the efforts related to the church organ. The new console is on site as Jen and Hasty do the tedious task of re-wiring 100+ year old cables so the console and the pipes work together. The organ is expected to be ready by Easter.

Fr. Eric gave his annual report including efforts underway to bring the Hispanic Mission to fruition and planning for post-COVID reopening efforts.

Deep gratitude was expressed for all the support and patience parishioners provided through what proved to be a year of big challenges and significant spiritual growth.

Family Promise Has a Plan



Mission: The mission of Family Promise, both in Brevard County and Nationally is to end family homelessness by collaborating with our community to provide families with the support and resources they need to achieve long standing stability.

The Future: While maintaining and growing existing programs, FPOB will focus on launching new initiatives to prevent homelessness from happening in the first place.

The Plan: Family Promise of Brevard created a Strategic Plan based on creating and executing new initiatives as well as maintaining excellence in current programs.

It has four components:

- **Expand Affordable Housing:** Expand infrastructure and resources to advocate for affordable housing.
- **Engage Partners & Donors:** Grow, educate, & energize our volunteers, donor, partners, & the community at large.
- **Ensure Service Excellence:** Maintain integrity and excellence in our existing and new services programs.
- **Elevate our Organization:** We must be recognizable and trusted as people and as an organization for all to see.

We, St. John's Episcopal Church, must support these initiatives as they develop, in whatever way we can. Our Family Promise Coordinators, Ben Kendall and Lee Steininger, will keep abreast of initiatives and ways we can help. We will look to all for support and involvement in the shelter program when it resumes.

Vestry Notes

December 17, 2020

The Steve Bradley, Treasurer, proposed and the Vestry approved the 2020 Hispanic Restricted Funds Summary

Lee Steininger, Sr. Warden, requested the Vestry approve \$950 to upgrade the outlets in the kitchen to GFCI (as required by code) and add two circuits to allow for multiple coffee makers, griddles, etc. Resolution passed with funds coming from the Capital Projects Account.

Lee reported that Bill Chernault and he would do future grounds preparation for internment in the Memorial Garden.

Kathy Oas, Jr. Warden, reported \$350-\$360 was spent on digital, non-electronic marine grade locks for the Parish Hall and Sanctuary doors. Thanks to Richard Huffman for getting them installed.

Kathy expressed ongoing concern about locking up all areas of the church after use.

Organ renovation is proceeding, expecting to be completed by Easter
A completed Housing Allowance Designation Resolution for the Rector for 2021 was approved.

Steve Bradley distributed copies of the latest iteration of the 2021 budget, (available at stjohnsmlb.org > About > Vestry Documents). As presented, the budget is balanced.

A motion was made to accept the budget as presented. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

2021 Vestry and Officers: The slate of candidates running for 2021 Vestry to fill 3 vacancies was presented - Skip Alcorn, Susan Badgio, Gail Dunbar, Deborah Miller-Caldwell, Karen Taff.

Delegates to the Diocesan Convention: The convention will be fully online on Saturday, February 6, 2021. A slate of 3 delegates and one alternate were presented: Lee Steininger, Katie Wilson, Andy Weeks, Kathy Oas (alternate). A motion was made to accept the slate as presented.

It was agreed that the Annual Parish Meeting would be held February 6, 2021 at 8:30 a.m. both in-person and via Zoom, with provisions made to allow voting for all.

January 21, 2021

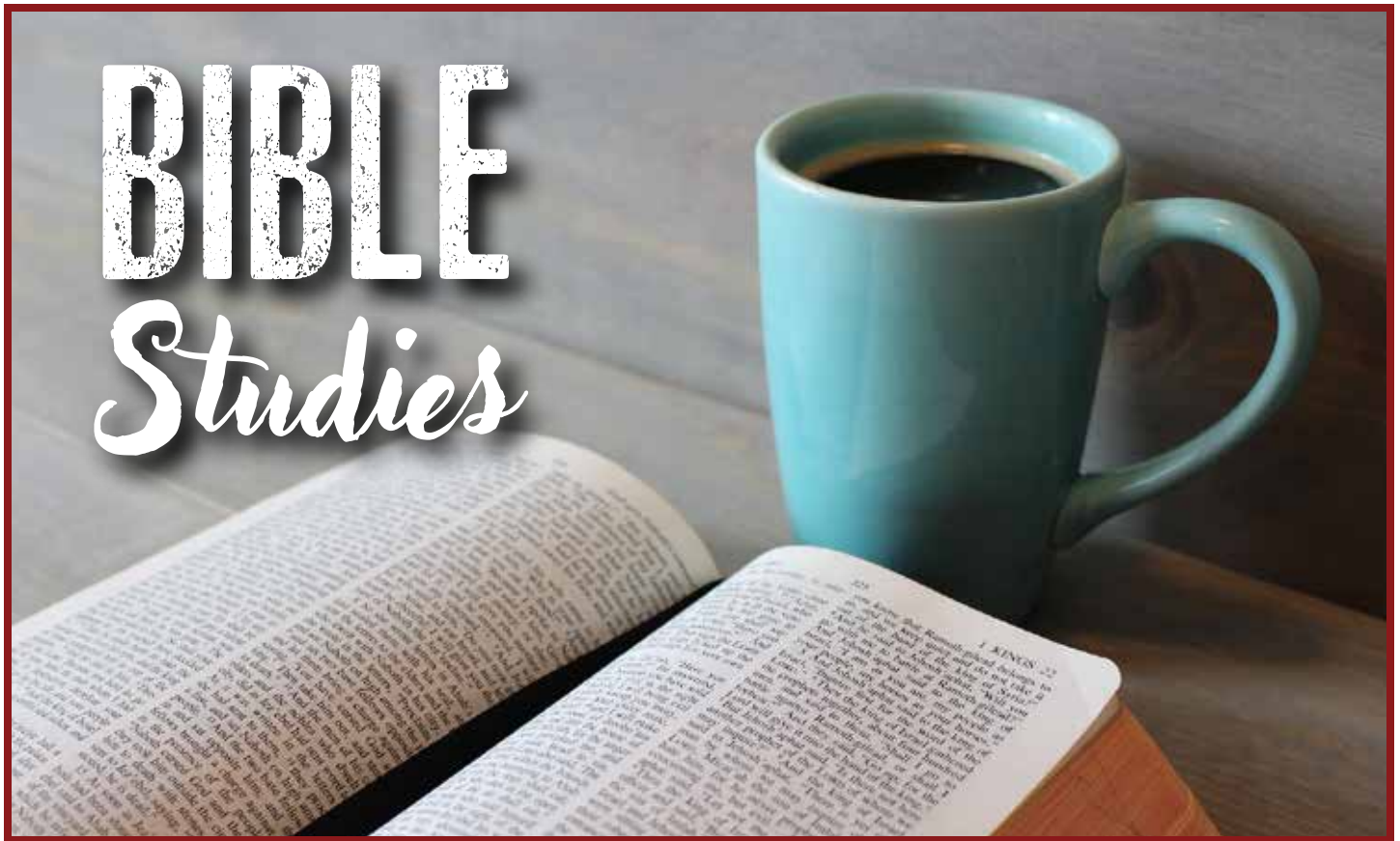

Parson's Purse funds are still being sought with the intent of delivering checks at the Annual Parish Meeting. Lee noted this was his final Sr. Warden's Report and expressed thanks for support and the opportunity to serve.

Fr. Eric reported that Jen Lester, music minister, requested the month of January 2021 off as unpaid leave. This request was granted.

The 2021 Lenten program is designed to address Covid-19 restrictions. The Way of Love and the seven spiritual disciplines will be presented on Wednesday evenings for 7 weeks at 7:00 pm beginning Ash Wednesday, February 17. This series will be via Zoom and include limited in-person attendance. The sessions are expected to last approximately 45 minutes and will consist of a short video, teachings, and Compline. There will be no Soup Suppers this year.
