

Scouts at St. John's

St. John's has a long history of hosting and supporting a Cub Scout pack. During the pandemic, the pack stopped meeting, but when they were ready to begin meeting again, we could not

accommodate them within the requirements placed on St. John's by our Diocesan protocols, so they began meeting at a nearby VFW hall. We continued as the "Charter Organization" (every Boy Scout Troop or Cub Scout Pack has an affiliated Charter Organization). When we were again able to host on our property, they decided they preferred having the Cub Scouts at the VFW hall. However, the same leaders were also running a Boy Scout Troop that needed a new home and Charter Organization. So, we welcomed them on Tuesday evenings, and we are now the Charter Organization for both.

Fr. Eric is friends with one of the leaders of another Boy Scout troop that has met for many years at what is now Highland Avenue Fellowship Church (formerly St. Mark's U.M.) The leadership of Highland Ave. Church no longer wants to carry the Charter and the Scouts approached St. John's to see if we might be able to help. We cannot host their meetings, nor can we store their equipment (they have a LOT of equipment, including 5 trailers, a 15-passenger van, and a full storage shed) but with Vestry approval, we would be willing to Charter them. That is, indeed, what we will be doing. Highland Avenue Fellowship Church is allowing them to continue to meet there, while they pursue a new home.

Daughters of the King

The Daughters of the King have a prayer box next to the candles in the sanctuary for individuals' confidential prayer requests. A Daughter monitors the box weekly so requests can be prayed for immediately.



Each Sunday, a Daughter will process the prayer box to the altar for these requests to be offered up to our Lord and blessed by the priest. These requests remain confidential within our group as we pray over them daily. If you want Fr. Eric to be aware of the request, please inform him separately; the Daughters will not pass along any requests. We take our confidentiality seriously and are honored that we are entrusted with these petitions.

Prayer is available at the altar after each Sunday service, and Daughters, as well as others, are involved as "intercessors." If you need prayer, we encourage you to come to the altar. It is a privilege and honor for us to pray for you. Thank you for entrusting us with your heart-felt petitions. How may we pray for you?

A Testimony

What should she do? A former employer asked her to return to work. She was comfortable and very content in her current retirement state. She had family and volunteer responsibilities that required time and attention. But she lived in a world of political division where people were, behind the curtain of electronics, casting off the filters of decency. Curated news and information fed through her preferred media painted a bleak picture. Inflation, interrupted supply chains, and global viruses left her wondering: Is her savings enough to sustain retirement? Should she answer the siren song and return to a paid job? After all, a job provided some cover from the crazy and she would no longer be on a fixed income. Provocative!.

But she had been attending church regularly for several years now. There she learned how to read and better understand the Bible. She learned how God works in our lives, loving us but only leaning in if we invite Him to do so. Being and working with other church attendees, she learned how God works in the lives of others, changing hearts, minds, and behaviors. She learned our talents are God-given. She learned that being a good Steward means giving time, talent, and treasure so those God-given gifts can benefit others. She also learned to pray.

The answer was to ask God's direction on what to do. So she did, but she expected a clear burning-bush type answer. A memo with bullet points would be awesome, but that did not happen. Immediate on-the-spot response? Not so much.

After asking for God's direction on what to do, she became aware how the same societal, cultural, and financial pressures she felt were also impacting her church. The increased cost of water, electricity, and services she saw in her own bills were ten-fold for her church. And some people who used to be regular attendees were unseen. And what about those empty pews Sunday after Sunday?

God's answer became very clear - give her time to the employer and the treasure to the church. But she was not all in on this answer! She could use that additional treasure to stave off her own financial uncertainty. She could re-model her house! She could buy that coveted item! But time spent with God on this decision further opened her heart to His will so that is what she did. She took the job and gives the income to the church. But every time she writes that check, she needs (and so far gets) God's help to hand it over. But it's SO HARD!

The lesson learned: Giving time, talent and treasure to the glory of God can take unexpected paths.

IMPORTANT NOTE: This story is true and the reader may even be able to guess who 'she' is. But know this - she does not seek nor want recognition or celebration for this decision. What is important to know is God really does work within us, changing our hearts, minds, and behaviors to identify His solution which is THE solution. That is what is worthy of our celebration and recognition.

Musician's Musings from Dr. D.

For a number of years, Dr. Willis Bodine, retired professor of church music at the University of Florida served as the parish musician at the church of Saint Michael and All Angels Church - the Episcopal Church on Sanibel Island. He wrote this "Vision Statement" which rather eloquently states much of what we are doing at St. John's parish:

VISION STATEMENT

As part of The Episcopal Church (the denomination in the United States related to the worldwide Anglican Communion), the people in this community of faith come together to worship God, to offer their prayer and praise, and to lift their voices as part of the 'great choir of gathered Christians.'

Worship music at Saint Michael's Church is in the broad mainstream of Anglican styles, marked by

- •Words from Scripture, and from sources congruent with Scripture
- •Melodies from 2000 years of Christian worship experience from earliest plainsong to fresh phrases written this year, from Lutheran chorales based on medieval chants to American shape note tunes, from Mendelssohn to Messiaen and Marshall and Mason and Mealy selected to enrich the people's voice in this faith community
- •Instrumental timbres that support worship the varied sounds of pipes, strings, bells, winds with the Psalmist, "All that hath breath, praise ye the LORD"
- •With Saint Paul, singing both with spirit and also with understanding a sense of enthusiasm and energy in what we do, and with knowledge about our faith song The Canons of The Episcopal Church are specific about music in worship. The rubrics of the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer* dealing with music are very careful statements, and they guide our choices from *The Hymnal* 1982 and its several supplements. The Parish Choir devotes time each week to prepare for its role of musical leadership in the liturgical life of Saint Michael's Church.

Varied rhythms of parish life — in the Church year and seasons, in Eucharist liturgies at different times and places, or in musical compositions of different styles — serve to enliven musical elements of our worship when we come together. Guided by the Spirit, we celebrate the Holy Eucharist as the principal act of Christian worship. Music is integral to our worship of God as texts are conveyed, our praise and prayer are offered, our faith is nourished, and our hearts and minds and voices are lifted.

Thank you, Willis, and Amen.

Vestry Notes

The Vestry met on Thursday, October 20. Steve Bradley, Treasurer reported. Letters will be sent from the Treasurer to those parishioners whose 2022 pledges are substantially behind amounts pledged. The end-of-year deficit is projected to be \$11,000. Donations to Outreach are at an all-time high. The draft 2023 budget was circulated and discussed.

Deborah Miller-Caldwell, Jr. Warden, distributed copies of the October 2022 report. Continuing to evaluate options for the parish hall roof while response from the insurance company is pending. A Parish Work Day is scheduled for November 12, 2022.

Fr. Eric reported that the Evensong worship service and dinner held in September was well attended and deemed a success. A weekly staff meeting has been established on Thursdays at 11:00am.

The 2023 Stewardship Campaign is underway.

The Vestry met on Thursday, Nov. 17. Deborah Miller-Caldwell, Jr. Warden, reported that the Insurance Adjuster inspected the roof and his report is expected soon. There is a \$15,000 deductible on this policy.

Vestry Notes (con't)

Music Director's office has new vinyl flooring. The Workday on Nov. 12 was quite successful. The two window AC/heat units were installed in Nick House (Wavecrest rental) rather than replacing the central unit. The Boy Scouts will install a new flagpole this week in the park. AC units annual service contract proposal (\$840 from Florida Breeze) was discussed.

Fr. Eric said the November 13th Concert Series in the Park event was well attended (about 55 meals served, 70 in attendance).

Fr. Eric will take his final week of 2022 vacation Jan. 20-26. Fr. Terry will celebrate Jan. 22.

The Vestry met on Thursday, Dec. 15. Deborah Miller-Caldwell, Jr. Warden, reported that we will get a settlement from our insurance carrier for about \$21,000 for storm damages to the parish hall roof. Repairs were authorized up to \$25,000 for roof replacement and wood repair/replacement as may be required. Work should begin in 4-5 weeks.

Steve Bradley, Treasurer, reported that the results of the 2023 Stewardship Campaign were encouraging in new and increased pledges, it was not enough to fully make up for a loss of about \$30K from folks who have died or moved away. A 2023 budget was approved with a current deficit of just over \$4,000.

Kathy Oas, Jamie Hamilton and Linda Fletcher were elected as Delegated to the 2023 Diocesan Convention coming Feb. 3-4. The Annual Parish Meeting will be Sunday, Feb. 5 beginning at 8:30 in the Parish Hall.

Our Adult Christian Education class meets Sundays, 9:00 - 9:40 a.m., in the Parish Hall. On January 8 we will begin a study of the *Book of Common Prayer* (BCP). If there is any document that defines the Episcopal Church, it is this book. To understand the Episcopal Church and why we do things the way we do them requires an understanding of the BCP. We will begin with a couple of sessions on the history, development and contents of the BCP, then we'll take a more careful look at some of the specific rites there, especially Baptism and Holy Communion.

We are moving this class to the Parish Hall to accommodate a larger group. Zoom will still be available, but at a lesser quality as the sound is difficult in the larger room.
