John saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God."

The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see."

They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).

THE SERMON



We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him.

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.

The Breaking of the Bread

Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

Due to COVID restrictions, wine is by "intinction" only. No one sips from the common cup. If you wish to receive the wine, after the clergy places the bread in your hand, just hold it out for the chalice bearer, who will dip it in the wine and place it on your tongue. If you do not wish to receive the wine, simply consume the bread and cross your arms over your chest when the

THIS MORNING'S MUSIC

Raised in a Moravian family of missionary parents, James Montgomery (1771-1854) was attracted by the Wesleys' social concerns and later, when he became editor of the *Sheffield Iris*, he championed many unpopular causes, being twice imprisoned for reporting news unfavorable to the government. "Angels from the realms of glory" is a call for all (angels, shepherds, wise men, saints and us) to come and worship the new-born King as told in the Christmas stories of Luke 2 and Matthew 2.

"Ye servants of God" comes to us from Charles Wesley's *Hymns for Times of Trouble and Persecution* (1744) which has four hymns with a strange title, "Hymns to be sung in a Tumult" and refer to the absurd and slanderous accusation that the Wesleys were attempting to overthrow the Crown. Their meetings were broken up, their people mobbed, plundered, and dragged before magistrates. As Frank Colquhoun has written, "We can readily picture the small but heroic Methodist bands facing the fury of their enemies with a triumphant song like this upon their lips." The hymn is now a hymn of praise extolling God's sovereignity and magnifying the glories of Christ. (From *Hymn Notes* by Austin Lovelace)

How does "Jesus calls us" written for a minor saint's day by a Victorian hymn writer known for her pedagogical hymns for children become one of the most often sung hymns on Christian discipleship? Mrs. Cecil Frances Alexander (1818-1895) was one of the most beloved hymn writers of the nineteenth century. Hymnologist Alfred Bailey captures the context of Mrs. Alexander's hymns: "Before her marriage she had been a member of the Evangelical wing of the Anglican Church. That fact shows in her intense devotion to the religious education of children." By contrast, her husband William Alexander was a Tractarian—what might be called a "high church" devotee today-following the ethos of the Oxford Movement. She authored more than four hundred hymns-most of which were written for children before she was married. These were published in several collections, the most popular being Hymns for Little Children (1848) from which we still sing "All Things Bright and Beautiful"-based on "I believe in God, the Father, maker of heaven and earth"— and "Once in Royal David's City"—interpreting (I believe) in Jesus Christ, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary." "Jesus Calls Us o'er the Tumult" is the exception in that it was not written as a children's hymn and was composed after her marriage. The hymn first appeared in a collection called Hymns for Public Worship (1852), published by the Society for the Propagation of Christian Knowledge (SPCK), Tract No. 15, as a

hymn for St. Andrew's Day, November 30, displaying her priority for the Christian year.

Fasten your seat belts! We begin a new setting of the *Gloria in excelsis*! This one was composed by our Organist/Choirmaster for the Church of St. Luke, in Hot Springs, AR. We are told it's an easy setting to learn, but like all new tunes, it will take some time and repetitions to become familiar. Why change the setting? Like all things used over and over, we become complacent and the words lose their impact. Always bear in mind that everything we sing was once new to us.


