We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully

confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.



Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith: *Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.*

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him.

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.


# The Breaking of the Bread


Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us; *Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!* 


The gifts of God for the people of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.


The usher will indicate when it is time for your row to come forward to the altar rail to receive Communion. If you wish to receive Communion in your pew, please let the usher know and it will be brought to you. When you go forward, an usher will indicate where to kneel at the rail, then hold your hands in front of you, one on top of the other, to receive the bread. Wine is by "intinction" only, no one sips from the common cup. If you wish to receive the wine: after the clergy places the bread in your hand, just hold it out for the chalice bearer, who will dip it in the wine and place it on your tongue. If you do not wish to receive the wine, simply consume the bread and cross your arms over your chest until the chalice bearer passes by, then return to your seat.





#### THIS MORNING'S MUSIC

When Dr. D. first planned to play the *Milonga del Angel* for St. Andrew's in Ft. Pierce he was somewhat apprehensive of offering a tango as an introduction to worship. He shouldn't have been, because it engendered more positive comments than perhaps anything else he played while directing the music there. Astor Piazzolla (1921-1992) was an Argentine tango composer, bandoneon (a type of accordion) player, and arranger whose works revolutionized the traditional tango into a new style termed nuevo tango, incorporating elements from jazz and classical music. The "Angel's Dance" is a charming, evocative miniature for piano.

Sir Frederick Arthur Gore Ouseley (1825-1889) was an English composer, organist and musicologist born in London. He was professor of music at Oxford from 1855 to 1889 and in 1856 he became vicar of St. Michael's College on the outskirts of Tenbury Wells. "From the rising of the sun" is one of his few works still in the repertory, but it is a staple of the Cathedral repertory.

The focus of our opening hymn When Morning Gilds the Skies is praise to Jesus Christ, and it is essentially a hymn a praise – not a morning hymn. Any time is the right time to praise Christ – morning, evening, work, or prayer. The original text had 14 stanzas, and hymnal editors make different choices, which creates slightly different versions in various hymnals. Barnby's tune, written for this text, has helped to make the hymn popular with its final rousing phrase of "May Jesus Christ be praised." (From Hymn Notes by Austin Lovelace)


