Database Roll-Out

The first round of emails inviting members to log in and create an account on our church database have gone out. If you did not receive one, and believe that you should have, please contact the church office at office@stjohnsmlb.org.

This will contain instructions on how you create your account and password. Your email will be your username and you will create your own password. Please be sure to write it down as we cannot see it or retrieve it for you.

Once you have done that, find someone you've wanted to get to know better and invite them for coffee, or beer, or whatever suits you!

There has been some confusion about how this connects to the calendar and the church newsletter, so let's try to clarify. The Good News online version is stored on the church website, NOT in Realm. If you don't have the printed copy handy, you can always access the Good News by going to stjohnsmlb.org, point to About and click on Church Newsletters.

The database has an email function which is used to send out the link to the online newsletter, so that email comes from Realm, but the newsletter is at the website.

The church calendar is also maintained on the church website, NOT on Realm. We use Google Calendars and it can be viewed by going to stjohnsmlb.org and clicking on the Calendar link. You may see some calendar items on Realm, but these are NOT up to date. The best information is always at stjohnsmlb.org. This is an issue that has been quite frustrating with Realm. Their security is set up so that Realm cannot read our calendar information from Google Calendars, nor can we use the Realm calendar and have that available on the website. We have been told that they are working on a fix for this, but in the meantime, always check stjohnsmlb.org for calendar updates.

You can also access the database on your phone using the app Realm Connect (available for both iPhone and Android). You'll use the same username and password that you created for Realm.

What a pleasure it is to be with you here. As I complete my first full year as your music director, I am grateful for the progress we have made in assembling a music program for the parish.

As I have said to almost every congregation I've served, if you like what we're doing tell everybody you know. If you don't like what we're doing, tell me. Those of you with whom I've had the privilege of chatting so far will, I believe, attest that I'm easy to talk to and thoroughly enjoy meeting people. Outreach Focus - Sharing His Love


July and August

St. John's is introducing a new Complementary Cancer Care as a new Outreach partner for July and August. Gail Dunbar, parishioner, and choir member, is on the advisory board for this organization. A non-profit program that offers free counseling, transportation, yoga, art, support groups, wigs and head coverings, and many other resources to complement traditional cancer treatments. They are funded by donations and grants. The organization was founded by an oncol



treatments. They are funded by donations and grants. The organization was founded by an oncology nurse, a yoga instructor, and an engineer. The current president is a licensed clinical social worker and herself a cancer survivor.

Solar Light for Africa's Summer Mission





Among our projects we will light a school for deaf children in Lira, northern Uganda. This is not our first school for deaf children, but this is a large one and more remote. It is sponsored by the Ugandan Minister of Health, a Cabinet level post, so this one could get more press attention than usual. In any case, these are particularly exciting systems to do because the light is so meaningful to the deaf. We will also light a remote primary school sponsored by Otino Waa, a large orphanage in Lira that operates several "satellite" schools in more remote areas and that we have worked with for many years.

Back in Kampala, we will light two "slum schools" in very poor sections of Kampala. While technically supported by the government, these schools are woefully underfunded and cannot connect to the electrical grid as they would not have the money to pay the power bill. These lighted facilities become beacons of light and hope for their dark communities.

Finally, while in Jinja (on the shore of Lake Victoria) we will light teacher homes at two schools being renovated by Soft Power Education, a group based in England that we work with regularly. Lighting teacher homes on the school sites helps them attract and retain better teachers.

Of course, we will also see some of the sights, go on a safari, celebrate the cultural heritage and shop for souvenirs. We return to the US on July 23 and I'll be back in the office Tuesday, July 25.

We learned sobering facts at the last Coordinators' Meeting sponsored by Family Promise of Brevard. Pre-Covid quarantine, there were sufficient host churches to fill all hosting weeks. Since that time many churches have stepped away and the current status is the families are put into motels, missing the socialization with church communities. We are proud to say St. John's has stayed the course filling a much-needed service of meals, fellowship, and a safe place to sleep for families going through the intensive work of stabilizing their lives. They come out of the process with long-term housing.

We were overjoyed to welcome a few new volunteers during our last hosting. Individuals who were uncertain how the process worked but said 'yes' when asked. Thank you! We coordinators work very hard to assure St. John's FPOB volunteers are supported during the host week - answering questions, problem solving, being on site, and/or available via phone to help.

- Join one of Gail Dunbar's Heaven's Kitchen volunteers as they prepare and serve an evening meal. Time investment - 2-3 hours, one evening during hosting week.

- Join the mealtime/post-mealtime fellowship.
 - Time-investment 2 hours, one evening during hosting week.

St. John's Church is having its last touches of paint notwithstanding the sudden showers we have had lately. Mr. Siller is a finished artist with the brush.

Numbers of hogs have again made their appearance on the south side of the Eau Gallie river, to the detriment of the orange trees in that part of our town. It is rumored that they are owned by Melbourne residents."

The Vestry met on Thursday, April 20

Two fire and liability insurance bills were paid in 1st quarter which hurts those financials. May and June should be better and hopefully the months after.

Steve Bradley announced this will be his last Vestry meeting as he closes on his new house (in NC) on the date of the next Vestry meeting. Father Eric and the Vestry thank Steve for his 15 years of service. Steve will send in his resignation over the weekend. With this resignation, Elizabeth Chludzinski becomes the Treasurer.

\$600 for a new microphone for the choir loft will be paid from the Restricted Memorial Fund.

Flag was replaced by the Scouts following wind damage.

August Vestry meeting moved to August 10th. There will be no July meeting unless Sr. Warden Kathy Oas decides it is needed.

The Vestry met on Thursday, May 18

Treasurers Report: The deficit is caused by higher-than-expected expenses, not lower income.

\$499 for a new lectern mic will be paid from the Restricted Memorial Fund.

Junior Warden's Report: Father Eric gives the report in Deborah's stead. The sewing guild that meets in the church paid for railing to be installed at the step when exiting the parish hall to west. During Family Promise hosting the sewer line from the Parish Hall bathrooms backed up. This has been repaired and there is no ongoing problem. A new front door has been installed on James House.

Vestry Notes (con't)

Deborah and Father Eric propose a special project in the fall to replace the Parish Hall and kitchen floor, the kitchen counters, and the Parish Hall doors. Estimates will be sought to establish the cost. A special funding plea would be needed. Jackie Bond reports that Daily Bread has requested our help every fifth Sunday starting in October. The Outreach Team has agreed.

The Vestry met on Thursday, June 15

The deficit for the end of May is worrisome, in excess of \$16,000. Elizabeth Chludzinski reports, however, that June is off to a very good start so we should see a health surplus in June and a reduction in the deficit.

The heater for the Nursery and Treasurer's office has been replaced and various repairs were completed on the irrigation system.

The 2022 Parochial Report was presented, discussed, and approved for forwarding to the Diocese.

A small update to St. John's Mission Statement was approved and it now reads:

St. John's is a worshiping community, guided by Scripture, growing servants of Christ, and sharing Jesus' love in word and deed.

The summer schedule was reviewed. Fr. Terry will be available and will conduct services when Fr. Eric is away.
