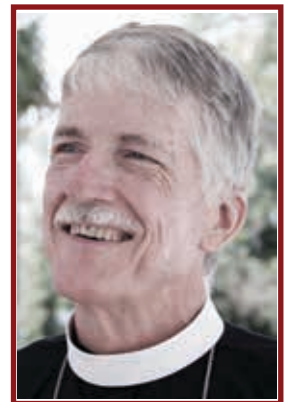

A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

This is the season of New Year's Resolutions. What will it be for you? To lose weight; reconcile a broken relationship; find that new job; "get back to church;" win the lottery? Of course, I wouldn't presume to tell you what yours should be, but I will encourage you to consider a couple of things in deciding what to focus your energy on in the coming year.



Choose a goal that matters. Among the most popular New Year's Resolutions are to lose weight/eat better/get in shape/etc. Looks come and go – well, mostly looks go. Don't make resolutions based on how you look. Over the long haul, you will surely fail. Taking proper care of the body that God has given you is a worthy resolution, but be sure health and well-being is what drives you, not just what you see in the mirror. This is about sharpening ourselves for God's service, not looking like those people in magazines.

Choose a goal that will matter next year. In a year, will it really matter that you finally got the attic cleaned out? That may need doing, but don't elevate it to a status it doesn't deserve.

Choose a goal that will matter in ten years. When your kids are gone and you hardly ever see them, will that extra promotion you knocked yourself out for really seem that important? Our when your kids and grandkids are all grown up, will you be satisfied with the time you invested with them?

In all the deathbed conversations I've had, never has anyone said they wished they'd worked harder or spent less time with their family. But reconciling with that estranged friend or family member, or just spending time with those you love – that will last for years to come!

Choose a goal that will matter for a lifetime. “For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.” (Matthew 6:21) If you're going to invest, invest where the dividends spread out over not just your waistline, or your checkbook, but over all aspects of your life, family and relationships. Attention to our relationship with the Lord pays out in all areas of our lives, and you will never be sorry for that!

Finally, though it may seem like a contrast to what I've said above, think small. I've seen far too many ambitious resolutions fall quickly by the wayside. Too much is, well, too much. I see much more success with small changes that you can really follow through on. Don't worry about running a marathon – start by walking around the block every day. Don't try to have a 2-hour prayer time every day – go for 10 minutes. Don't try to read the Bible in a month. Just read a little bit each day. There are lots of great resources available here at church as well as online. In my experience, it's the little changes that add up. Big changes too often do not succeed.

As we begin a New Year, may we remember always that each day is a gift from God, and may we see each day as a new opportunity to serve Him! May the Lord bless you in 2024 with new opportunities to serve and a deeper dependence on Him!

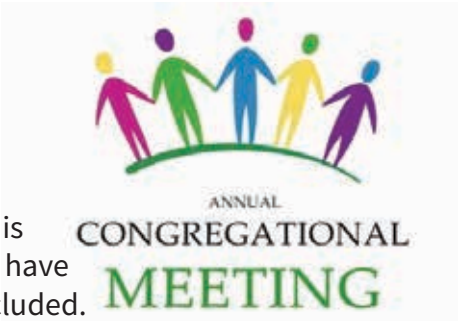

Vestry Notes

October 19, 2023

A quorum has not been met, therefore, these are 'notes', not 'minutes'.

Deborah Miller-Caldwell, Jr Warden reported that repairs on the rental unit on Shady Lane totaled \$1,070.00 this month. Hambel's plumbing was called to repair several plumbing issues. The hot water heater in the sacristy leaked and dumped an estimated 15 gallons of water on the carpet. Richard Huffman removed the hot water heater and it will not be replaced. There appears to be no lasting damage.

November 16, 2023

Minutes from the September 21 Vestry meeting were approved and notes from the October meeting and mini-retreat were reviewed.

Kathy Oas, Sr. Warden reported that she has filled the slate for the Vestry elections with the following people: Katie Wilson for a 1-year term; Julie Miller for a 2-year term; Elizabeth Chludzinski, Peter Fischel and Ben Kendall for 3 year terms. Elections will be held at the Annual Parish Meeting, January 28, 2024. Additional nominations may be submitted until that time.

Deborah Miller-Caldwell, Jr Warden reported that the water bill for the church and hall was exceptionally high, presumably due to the water heater leak in the sacristy. Deborah has filed a claim with the City of Melbourne asking for the sewer charge to be reduced because of the water leak which was dumped outside and did not enter the sewer. It will take 8-10 weeks for the City of Melbourne to decide if St. John's will get a credit on the sewer charge.

On November 4, 2023 a Workday was held. Deborah thanks everyone who participated in the Workday.

Fr. Eric Turner, Rector reported that Fr. Terry will no longer be the associate rector as of the end of the year. A Coffee Hour will be held in his honor on January 7. Upcoming events in the Concert series include Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper with a Dixieland Jazz Band, Choral Evensong in March, Harbor City Harmonizers and the Harbor City Harmonizers in April.

Ongoing tabulation of results of the stewardship campaign and the development of the 2024 budget were reviewed but no action was taken.

Vestry Notes (con't)

The Diocesan Convention will take place on Saturday, January 27 in Winter Park. Three delegates are needed from St. John's. Deborah Miller-Caldwell and Amy Lacy will be delegates, and another will be sought. We will meet at the church between 7:00 and 7:30 a.m. and be back around 5:00 p.m.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held January 28, 2024 at 8:30 a.m. in the parish hall.

*In September, a deposit of \$3900 (pre-paid rent from Wavecrest Academy) was incorrectly credited as income for that month. This money should have gone into the Restricted Account and we move the monthly rent from there into income month by month. \$3,900 of the October Actual expense is these funds being moved to the Restricted Account. So, the expenses for October were actually \$23,675, just slightly under budget. This also means that the deficit for October of \$12,742 is overstated by \$3,900. The Year-to-Date numbers correctly reflect the church's financial position at the end of October.

Prospective Vestry Member Profiles

Katherine Codlin-Wilson (Katie Wilson). 1-year term

I began attending Vestry meetings during late 2017. By January 2018, I was appointed as Vestry Secretary. Since then, I have attended Vestry meetings, either as the Secretary, a Vestry member, or both. I see my role at St. John's as supporting those who are St. John's leaders and St. John's seekers.

In my previous life I worked in corporate finance, took 17 years off to be a stay-at-home mom, taught reading and math for 10 years, and ended my work career in personal financial planning.

Ben Kendall 3-year term

I was born in Fort Worth, TX, but grew up and lived in Houston until 2015, when I followed my mom and sister to Florida.

I graduated from the University of Houston with a degree in Business focused on accounting, but when I got a call from a college roommate to join a startup, I jumped right in. The business went through some tough times, being merged, spun off, and sold, and I have been with them every step of the way. I am still employed at the legacy company. My positions with the company have ranged from client partner acquisition, trainer, department manager, technical coordinator, and telecommunications specialist, where I am today. Moving to the beach communities in Florida has been a big change from the size and the hustle and bustle of Houston.

My spiritual journey has been deeply rooted in the Episcopal church, with a hint of Presbyterian influence since childhood. I was a member of St Martin's Episcopal Church in Houston since 1988, before moving to Florida. I was always active in outreach ministries and small groups at St Martin's. My journey with St John's, the "little church that can," has been incredibly rewarding, giving me opportunities to serve on the vestry, Sunday Ministry as LEM, audiovisual, and Family Promise. I am glad to be here and thankful for any opportunity to serve.

Peter Fischel

I was born in Rochester, NY but a business trip to Florida for my father in November 1972 and a blizzard on his return home got us moved onto a sailboat in the Bahamas for a couple of years. I ended up growing up in Miami with my mom and three siblings. I spent much of my time on the water fishing and diving.

After high school, I attended the US Coast Guard Academy and the University of Miami, where I graduated with degrees in Marine Science and Biology. I promptly put professional development on hold to travel to Alaska and the South Pacific and to teach sailing in Key West.

In 1994 I attended Officer Candidate School for the NOAA Commissioned Officer Corps and began a 21-year career managing research platforms and labs in NOAA. I was assigned to ships and shore-side offices from Miami to Seattle and San Diego to Woods Hole. My work focused on fisheries research and management as well as marine sanctuaries. After my last assignment as captain of the NOAA Ship PISCES in Pascagoula, MS, I retired to Melbourne in 2015 to start a palm tree farm.

I have two sons, Aiden and Sam. Aiden attends EFSC and is applying to multiple universities to study zoology. Sam attends Jefferson Middle School and studies basketball and video games. My partner, Whitney Waite, also attends St. John's.

I was baptized Episcopalian as an infant but we attended a Presbyterian church in Miami while growing up. During my time in NOAA, I attended multiple churches throughout the country and enjoyed the diverse array of services. Upon settling in Melbourne, I attended several local churches before finding St. John's. I immediately felt at home here and look forward to many years of worship and service.

St. John's History Project

Do you remember Elizabeth Eyles? Liz was youth music director at St. John's in the 1970's. Born in 1952, Liz considered herself a semi-professional composer and was dedicated to composing religiously inspired pieces. She graduated from the Florida Technical University with a bachelor's degree in music.

During her time here, she composed a Mass especially for St. John's, entitled, "The Awakening" which she dedicated to her Grandfather, the Rev. John Matthews, vicar of All Saints Church, Weston, in the Diocese of Guildford, England. The piece of music became a part of the regular service for many years. Liz wrote at least 30 Christian songs; and many were performed at St. John's by the King's Kids.

Liz, who owned the Melbourne School of Music on Highland Avenue was quoted as saying in part, "The awakening of the Lord in society has a lot to do with the music used now. Music is a language that can reach people anywhere. It's the only art form that people come into contact with each day, one way or another. The more music done for the glory of God, the better."
