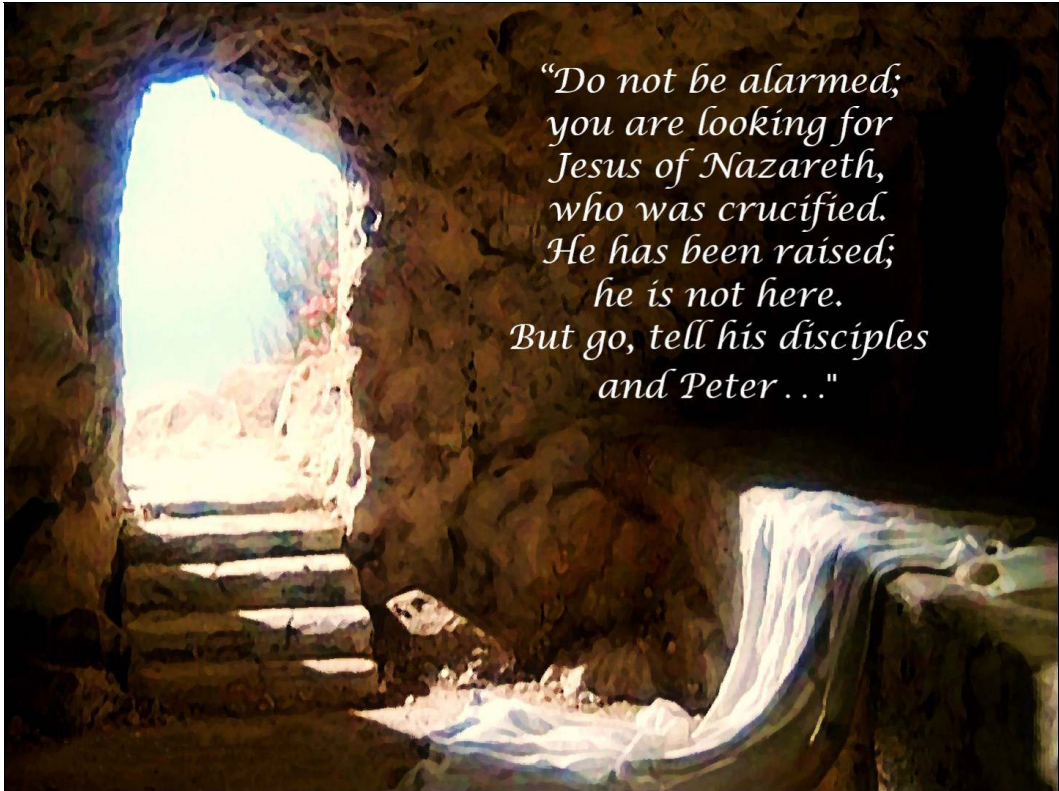

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

THE SERMON

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. Service of Admission for the Daughters of the King

Presenter: It is my privilege to present Lois Thayer as candidate for membership in The Order of the Daughters of the King.

Rector: We are gathered here in the sight of God and before this congregation to admit Lois into The Order of the Daughters of the King. We commend her to your earnest prayers that she may have grace to fulfill the obligations of the Order and that her labor may be to the glory of God and to the welfare of all His people.

Rector (addressing the candidate): The Daughters of the King is an Order for women whose mission is the extension of Christ's Kingdom, especially among women and girls, through prayer, service and evangelism. Do you desire to become a member of The Order of the Daughters of the King?



The Breaking of the Bread

Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

The gifts of God for the people of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

The usher will indicate when it is time for your row to come forward to the altar rail to receive Communion. If you wish to receive Communion in your pew, please let the usher know and it will be brought to you. When you go forward, an usher will indicate where to kneel at the rail, then hold your hands in front of you, one on top of the other, to receive the bread. Note that wine is by “intinction” only. No one sips from the common cup. If you wish to receive the wine, after the clergy places the bread in your hand, just hold it out for the chalice bearer, who will dip it in the wine and place it on your tongue. If you do not wish to receive the wine, simply consume the bread and cross your arms over your chest until the chalice bearer passes by, then return to your seat.

THIS MORNING'S MUSIC

“Light shines in the darkness” is a product of the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans in 2005 when Dr. D was directing the music at St. Paul’s Episcopal Church in the Lakeview district. The stone building withstood the hurricane force, the contents of the church were completely destroyed, but the large stained glass windows at both ends of the nave were spared. As soon as the electricity was restored the decision was made to turn the floodlights back on the front window so that it shone out – one of the very few Points of Light – to the Lakeview community which had been almost totally destroyed by the flooding. It was, as a great many people commented, a beacon of hope.

“Look there! The Christ, our brother comes” is Hymn 196 in our Hymnal 1982 but it’s almost a sure bet that no one in our congregation has ever sung it before. The music was composed by the late University of Michigan professor William Albright, whose 20th century ragtime works for piano earned him considerable fame. The hymn tune looks much more formidable than it really is, but the accompaniment is a bear to play, which probably accounts for its lack of familiarity.
