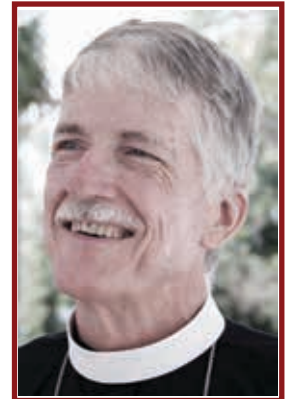

### A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

There are mixed emotions as I sit to write this, my last letter to all of you. I must begin with a thank you to the one person who has made it possible for me to serve as your rector, my wife Charlene! Without her love, support, cheerleading and forgiveness I don't think I'd have made it. She has been God's gift for me!



I am thankful to God and grateful to you for the 19½ years Charlene and I have had among you. It has been a privilege to serve you in this wonderful place. So, there is a sadness as I prepare to retire.

Yet, I wouldn't be honest if I didn't also say that there is great excitement for the next chapter in our lives, and also for the next chapter in the life of St. John's! Charlene and I have many plans and we're getting serious about some "bucket list" things. In the near term, we will leave for Uganda on July 10 to do some installations (including one paid for by St. John's donations in May) and enjoy some relaxation both in Uganda and in Dubai. In late September we will leave for a true "bucket list" trip, celebrating both my retirement and our upcoming 40th wedding anniversary (Dec. 15). We'll visit friends in Barcelona, then do a pilgrimage hike known as the "Camino de Santiago." We will hike from Sarria to Santiago, Spain, ending at a renowned Catholic Cathedral there, and hopefully continue with a visit to the coast of Portugal. After that will come some more sightseeing before we return in mid-October. In November we go to London for the wedding of a long-time family

I am excited to watch (from a distance!) the next chapter in the life of St. John's. I pray that God will bring you together with a new priest and a new vision for your life. St. John's needs to find a new growth footing for the decades ahead and I pray that you find it together with your new rector.

If I may be so bold, I will share a couple of thoughts about this transition. Do not compare this new person to me, or any other past clergy here at St. John's. Let them stand on their own two feet. This is not the time to look back or compare to the past. This is the time to embrace a new vision and a new future. This will mean changes, perhaps some painful, but it is a transition that St. John's must make.

And let me add that this applies to your new clergy spouse as well. Charlene has been a big presence here at St. John's and has made huge contributions to the life of the parish. Not all spouses will be either willing or able to do what she has done. Please do not compare the new clergy spouse to her, or expect that person to step into all that Charlene has done. Let them also find their own footing in the life of the parish.

Love your new priest as you have loved me, and even more so. Accept them as they are. Don't try to fashion them into your idea but let them be the leader that God has made them to be. Trust the work of the Holy Spirit in this, and I believe you will find fruit you never imagined.

Perhaps the most painful part of all this is that I must separate from the life of St. John's. After June 30, I cannot be your priest. You will need to make room for others to enter that role. I can't come back to do or even assist in your funerals, weddings, baptisms, etc. I'll be happy to see you around town, and to hear about all that God is doing in your life and in St. John's, but I cannot be your priest anymore.

It is truly said that the only constant in life is change. Embrace it, trusting the Lord will be with you in all of it!

- The list of names will be presented to Canon Dan, who will arrange a meeting and give the committee their instructions.
- The search team will create a church profile which will be matched with clergy profiles.

# Outreach Focus – Sharing His Love

## July and August Family Promise of Brevard



The Outreach focus for the months of July and August is Family Promise of Brevard. All donations in the blue or lilac envelopes, or clearly marked for Outreach, will go directly to Family Promise.

Working with the community, Family Promise provides temporary housing, meals, and services. Families in danger of losing their housing are helped by landlord mediation, rental assistance, utility support, and security deposits. They also work with single fathers and families with teenage boys, who often fall through the gaps of traditional support systems.

The 2023 impact in Brevard County alone helped 2,480 families. 98% of those helped maintained stable housing. 10,000 meals were provided and 9,440 volunteer hours worked. Visit [familypromiseofbrevard.org](http://familypromiseofbrevard.org) for more information.

## Vestry Notes

### April 18, 2024

Fr. Eric will prepare a note for the Good News providing the context and explanation for the deficit showing for the month of March, most of which is due to a large bill being paid early. Treasurer Elizabeth Chludzinski noted that expenses are going up. Paycor (our payroll service) has gone up 68% to \$193 per month. Triple D Grounds Maintenance has gone up 28% to \$430 per month.

Jack Lester, who has been mowing the Memorial Garden is graduating high school and going to the military, so a new person is needed.

Fr. Eric reported that Lent and Easter went nicely. The diocese is reminding us of the need for abuse prevention training online.

Deborah Miller-Caldwell, Jr. Warden, has moved and therefore stepped down from that position. Please be in prayer for a new Jr. Warden.

The Parochial Report was reviewed and accepted by the vestry.

### May 16, 2024

**Elizabeth Chludzinski, Treasurer**, needed to transfer \$5,000 from the Restricted account to make payroll and cover bills. Started May with \$1,763 in the Operating account. That is calling it close.

**Kathy Oas, Sr. Warden's reported that the** flagpole in the park was vandalized. The Scouts, who donated and installed it, were notified and they will replace the pole.

Keith Salmon was elected Treasurer as Elizabeth resigned due to personal commitments. Paul Mitz was elected Jr. Warden.

## Vestry Notes (con't)

Fr. Eric announced that he is retiring effective June 30. The announcement will be made Sunday May 19 and letters will go out that afternoon.

Canon Dan Smith from the Diocese of Central Florida then went over with the vestry what the process will look like for Fr. Eric's departure, the interim period, and seeking a new rector. The parish will be updated as progress is made.

## News from the Diocese

Bishop Justin Holcomb sent a letter to clergy and diocesan leaders providing an update on the status of Canterbury Retreat and Conference Center, the Diocesan retreat center located in Oviedo. Canterbury has struggled financially for some time, and this was accelerated during COVID. Sadly, recent analysis of the finances, debt and potential for Canterbury has made it clear that operations as a retreat and conference must come to an end. The Diocesan Board and the Canterbury Board will begin to study what would be the best use of the property as well as how to manage the approximately \$2 million in debt (which goes to the Diocese if Canterbury dissolves). Please pray for wisdom in this process.
