Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we

are bold to say,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. # The Breaking of the Bread

Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us; *Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!* 

The gifts of God for the people of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

The usher will indicate when it is time for your row to come forward to the altar rail to receive Communion. If you wish to receive Communion in your pew, please let the usher know and it will be brought to you. When you go forward, an usher will indicate where to kneel at the rail, then hold your hands in front of you, one on top of the other, to receive the bread. Note that wine is by "intinction" only. No one sips from the common cup. If you wish to receive the wine, after the clergy places the bread in your hand, just hold it out for the chalice bearer, who will dip it in the wine and place it on your tongue. If you do not wish to receive the wine, simply consume the bread and cross your arms over your chest until the chalice bearer passes by, then return to your seat.



#### THIS MORNING'S MUSIC

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, commonly referred to as the Feast of Christ the King, is a feast in the liturgical year which emphasizes the true kingship of Christ. It is a relatively recent addition to the liturgical calendar, instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI for the Roman rite of the Catholic Church. It typically marks the end of Ordinary Time, which continues up until Advent Sunday. It is now a part of our Anglican tradition and included in *The Book of Common Prayer*.

Flor Peeters (1903-1986) was a well-known Belgian composer, organist and teacher. In 1923 he became professor of organ at the Lemmens Institute and organist at the cathedral in Mechelen, Belgium, which he held for most of the rest of his life. His *Aria* for organ is one of his most engaging works.

Written by Edward Perronet (1726-1792), a friend and advisor of the Wesleys who later became a Congregational minister, "All hail the power of Jesus' Name" has had many alterations. John Rippon (1751-1836), famous for including "How firm a foundation" in his 1791 hymnal, added two new stanzas and extensively rewrote the others. Its extravagant praise and "crown Him" chorus become exuberant when sung to CORONATION, DIADEM, or MILES LANE – all equally popular tunes.\*

Sir Charles Villiers Stanford (1852 - 1924) was a composer, music teacher, and conductor of the late Romantic era. Born to a well-off and highly musical family in Dublin, he was educated at the University of Cambridge before studying music in Leipzig and Berlin. Stanford composed about 200 works, including seven symphonies, about 40 choral works, nine operas, 11 concertos and 28 chamber works, as well as songs, piano pieces, incidental music, and organ works. (from the *Wikipedia*)

Dr. D maintains that the work we hear this morning is very possibly the most often-performed piece of church music in existence. "Stanford in B flat" was the standard offering for most British choirs which offered a choral Morning Prayer just about every Sunday – to the point where it became something of a cliché. The *Jubilate* and its companion *Te Deum* are exceptionally well crafted and gracious to singers.

"Lead on, O King eternal was first published in *Hymns of the Faith*, 1887. For his graduation from Andover Theological Seminary in 1887, Ernest W. Shurtleff (1862-1890) was asked by his

classmates to write an appropriate hymn. Graduation is never an end – merely a road marker on the path of life. So the hymn is an appropriate call for us to be prepared to pitch our tents and to follow wherever God leads us. The rousing marching tune by the self-taught English organist and composer, Henry Smart, adds to the excitement of the call to march.\* \*From *Hymn Notes* by Austin Lovelace.
